Last two JMB Shura men captured

Saifullah held in capital, Salahuddin in Chittagong

The Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) captured Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) Majlish-e-Shura members Salahuddin and Khaled Saifullah in separate operations at Pahartoli in Chittagong and Demra in Dhaka

Tuesday evening and yesterday morning.

Before capturing Salahuddin, the Rab also arrested JMB Chittagong divisional commander Mizanur Rahman Shaon at a den where the Chittagong leaders of the banned militant outfit were scheduled to meet at a policymaking meeting, sources said. Salahuddin alias Salehin, who was tasked

with supervising JMB activities in Sylhet-Mymensingh region, was planning to initiate another round of militant attacks and had Tk 40,000 with him to distribute among his men for arranging the attacks, according to Rab.

Cautions EU envoy, says 150 observers will be sent

Ambassador Stefan Frowein, head of EU delegation in Bangladesh, has disclosed that the European Union will send over 150 observers for monitoring polls in the country and suggested creating "right condition" for all parties participation in the upcoming elections.

The Ambassador cautioned that boycott of polls this time around would be perilous for Bangladesh and called for finding a quick solution to differences over electoral reforms through dialogue.

'Boycott is very dangerous--it may lead to other problems... If you don't participate, you take a risk of

control," he said during an exclusive interview with the UNB. Frowein called for quickening

the process of proposed govern-ment-opposition dialogue to reach consensus on electoral reforms for free, fair and transparent elections where people could freely cast their votes for a new government or for theincumbent
