Prof Kabir Chowdhury, president of the advisory committee of Forum for Secular Bangladesh, yesterday blamed Prime Minister Khaleda Zia, her son Tarique Rahman and BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan for human rights violations in the country.

On their instructions, the law enforcers have been oppressing political leaders, journalists and women across the country, he said at a discussion on 'Human rights violation during the fundamentalist and communal alliance government'.

He also demanded trial of them and confiscation of property they have amassed through illegal means.

The Forum for Secular Bangladesh organised the discussion at the Women's Voluntary Association (WVA) auditorium in the city on the occasion of 77th birth anniversary of Shaheed Janani Jahanara Imam

The speakers called for making a list of those responsible for human rights violations during the rule of the fourparty alliance government and bringing them to justice.

Not only the members of law enforcement agencies, but also those who directed them to resort to repression should be on the list, they said.
