

International Cricket Council elite panel umpire Steve Bucknor has expressed outrage at some television production companies doctoring images to make umpires look bad and key players look good. Bucknor, who holds the world

record for the most appearances in Tests, has recounted personal experience of TV personnel misusing the TV technology to influence

"The World Cup," in the view of Britain's Royal Mail, "is the greatest single sporting event in the world." On the eve of the 18th tournament, the Royal Mail will issue six stamps

commemorating the 40th anniversary of England's own World Cup victory over Germany in 1966. They're scheduled for release June

Each stamp features one of the six national teams that have won the

World Cup since 1966. Topping the list of "World Cun

Winners" is Brazil. "The South Americans' intoxicating brand of football," the agency said, "has mesmerized spectators and opponents alike, and seen them win

an unprecedented five World Cups." The stamp images were produced before Britain raised postage rates in April, and some of the values have changed. The stamps (with old post-

age rate in parentheses) are: The 1st Class stamp represents England, the 42-pence (previously 40p) shows Italy, the 44p Argentina, the 50p (47p) Germany, the 64p (62p)

France and the 72p (68p) Brazil. The stamps were designed by Madeleine Bennett, who used photographs from the Getty Images agency. Germany will host the 2006 FIFA World Cup Tournament from June 9 to

July 9
