Sachin unsure of WI tour

Indian cricketer Sachin Tendulkar said on Friday it was too early to say whether he would be available for the upcoming Test series in the West Indies as he is still recovering from shoulder surgery.

"I am preparing to the best of my ability and feeling better now," said Tendulkar, 33.

"I have to undergo a fitness test in Mumbai on May 23. After that I will be able to tell whether I am fit for the West Indies. It is not the right thing to give my judgement before that," he

The Indian team for next month's four-Test series in the Caribbean will be named a day after Tendulkar's fitness test.

"At this moment the goal is to get fit as early as possible. That is what I was targeting for so many days. That remains my goal," Tendulkar said after a five-day fitness programme in the southern city.

"Whether I am going (to the West Indies) or not. I will still meet him and figure out how I am progressing, said one of the most prolific batsmen in contemporary cricket with a world record 35 Test and 39 one-day centuries

But a career spanning 16 years has begun to take its toll with a spate of injuries in recent times, the most notable being a tennis elbow problem two years ago that also required surgery

Opening batsman Upul Tharanga did his case for keeping a place in Sri Lanka's Test team no harm at all with a gritty 140 as the tourists scored 283 for four come stumps on the first day of four against Sussex here Thursday.

Former captain Sanath Jayasuriya arrived during the drawn first Test at Lord's concluded Monday, having reversed his retirement from the five-day game.

And although the veteran lefthanded opener was not included for the Sussex match, the tourists' last before next week's second Test at Edgbaston, Sri Lanka coach Tom Moody refused to rule Jayasuriya out of either the second or concludng third Test.

But Tharanga, who responded to the disappointment of making just 10 in Sri Lanka's meagre Lord's first innings of 192 by making 52 in their match-saving second innings of 537 for nine declared, carried on that good form, albeit against an understrength Sussex.

The 20-year-old, himself a lefthander, batted for five-and-a-halfhours before exiting shortly before the close when he mistimed a pull off Luke Wright to paceman James Kirtley, captain in his first match of the season since remodelling his bowling action. at mid-on.

Tharanga faced 252 balls with 18 fours



It's most noticeable on the side panels of the ierseys. Nike and Puma, however, have gone a different route, developing a specific look for each team.

So individual is the U.S. uniform, with a red-blue stripe down the left side of the white shirt, that the concept was continued down the left side, including the left sock. There's no danger of the players putting the sock on the wrong foot, either. Nike's socks this year are sewn for the right and left, and labelled as such.

None of the manufacturers will say how much their presence at the World Cup is worth

"The global market for soccer gear comes to billions of dollars a year. So by virtue of size alone -- the number of eyeballs, and the number of those eyeballs who are looking to spend -- the Cup is clearly extremely important," said Evan Osborne, who teaches sports economics at Wright State in Dayton, Ohio.

"If one of a company's sponsored teams wins the Cup, so much the better, but even being there is vital."
