900 CONTROVERSIAL VOTERS Why order to include them not illegal

HC asks govt, EC to explain

The High Court (HC) yesterday issued a rule on the government and Election Commission (EC) to explain within four weeks why the orders directing an assistant registration officer of Mohammadpur area to include voters in the draft electoral roll from 900 controversial forms should not be declared

The HC also directed the inspector general of police (IGP) to collect the 900 voters' registration forms from the office of Assistant Registration Officer (ARO) Aminul Huq Bhuiyan at Mohammadpu and produce those in the court

immediately. The court directed the law enforcement agencies not to arrest or harass Aminul, also assistant headmaster of Sher-e-Bangla Government High School, who disclosed the information to the media regarding inclusion of some 900 controversial voters in Agargaon area and receiving

Bus counter has 21 voters, entire village only 3

While a ticket counter of an interdistrict passenger coach service has 21 voters, only three voters live in an entire village, reveals the draft voter list.

Twenty-one voters on the draft electoral roll for Mohammadpur share Hanif Enterprise's ticket counter at Shyamoli in the capital as their common address.

In contrast, a village in Narail has only one man and two women of voting age. The village, Munshinagar in Salambad union under Kalia upazila, must be a

forlorn, forsaken place. At least 172 adult villagers must have either shifted to the nether world or somewhere else since 2000, as the voter roll prepared that year registered 175 voters in that village, reports our Khulna correspondent.

Some of them might have ended up at Mohammadpur in the capital, as the enumerators of the draft voter list found abundant voters here. Alike the Hanif Enterprise ticket counter, an office of the government's archaeology department in Babar Road has 50 voters and a clinic named Crescent

54KG HEROIN SHIPMENT

Tiles factory set up to cover up smuggling

AN APPEAL TO HONOURABLE FINANCE MINISTER MR. M. SAIFUR RAHMAN, M.P.,

Respected Finance Minister,

We humbly bring to your kind attention that CONSTRUCTION AND HOUSING SECTOR has contributed 18.25 per cent of the GDP during 2005. In terms of Taka it has been calculated to the amount of 59 thousand crores. Besides millions of workers and thousand of backward/forward linkage industries are also contributing to this sector to help the economic growth of the country.

Someone has recently moved to hinder the economic growth of the sector by lobbing to misguide the NBR to impose 13 per cent duty on MS Billet (All H.S. CODE 72.07) instead of existing 6 per cent on the pretext that local billet manufacturers are having problem in competing with Ingot and cannot set up more units. The surprising factor of the move is that it has been mentioned that ingot is the raw material of billet which is totally misleading and shows lack of knowledge about steel making. Ingot and billet are raw materials for M.S. Products and are same type of products totally independent of each other. Our member mills do not want such extra protection from the government and never wrote to any quarters to recommend this. End consumers such as Rehab members or other consumers do not want increase in duty of Billets because that will mean the cost of steel to them will increase substantially and the economy will face a down turn. This move is against your philosophy of sustainable growth. Moreover, price of billet (US\$460) is already much higher than the price of scrap (US\$260) so the effect of same rate of duty results in higher landed cost of billets compared to locally produced billets, hence the local billet making industry is in no threat with the current 6% duty. With the current power crisis in the country local steel mills are not being able to utilize 100% billet making capacities and therefore, some quantity of billet is imported to utilize rolling capacities.

Honourable Finance Minister,

We have all the confidence and trust on your wit and wisdom to keep and lead the country on the road to development. We just draw your kind attention through this appeal to stop this anti-development move and instruct NBR to maintain status quo with all policies related to steel melting and re-rolling industry.
