## Direct air links to be set up

### Cox's Bazar Declaration adopted

Saarc Tourism Ministers' Meet ended here yesterday through adoption of a 12-point declaration, including setting up of direct air links among member

Besides, the ministers also agreed on relaxing the existing visa processing system for the tourists in the member countries for ensuring their free movement within the Saarc states.

Addressing a press conference after the closing of the 2nd Saarc Tourism Ministers' Conference, State Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir announced the 12-point declaration, to be regarded as Cox's Bazar

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia inaugurated the conference in the morning. Ministers and deputy ministers from five member countries joined the conference, while Indian High Commissioner to Dhaka Bina Sicri represented the Indian side. Nepalese minister could not attend the conference.

Other highlights of the declaration include setting up of separate immigration counters at the airports of the member states for Saarc country's citizens, providing special facilities on tours by Saarc students, special facilities on pilgrims, increasing cooperation among the member states in the development of human resources for

were talking to Selim near a local hotel at around 8:30pm. At one stage they shot Selim in the head and back and fled the scene

Locals rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared him dead Police could not find out the

reason behind the killing. Officer-in-Charge of Mirpur Police Station said some unindentified assailants shot Monir dead at around 10:30pm.

He said Monir hailed from Gazipur.

"We are investigating to find out the reason behind the killing and identity of the killers," OC said.



Initially the contract has been signed with the partner organisa tions for two years with a budget of 3.86 million dollar (Tk 26 crore).

The agreement will be renewed for another three years with a budget of 15.65 million dollar after the successful completion of the first

Under the agreement, the activities will be implemented by the National TB Control Programme Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in partnership with a number of NGOs.

This is an example of public and private partnership approved by the Country Coordination Mechanism (CCM) of Bangladesh for securing a tuberculosis with the support of the

"At least 90 percent Boro was harvested so far and we hoped that the production would exceed 1.50 crore tonnes against the target of 1.45 crore tonnes," said Director General of DAE Ibrahim Khalil in the city yesterday

The country produced some 1.38 crore tonnes Boro Crop last year and 1.28 crore tonnes in 2004.

Khalil said use of record quantity certified seeds, favorable environmental condition, use of balanced

According to statistics, Boro crop was cultivated at least 43.20 lakh hectares of land this year, in which, hybrid seeds were used in two lakh hectares of cultivable lands, the highest one in the country's history so far.

Besides, sources from Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation (BADC) and DAE said that the BADC and DAE this year have doubled their seed production strength that helped achieve bumper production.

When asked about seed production strength, Khalil said, "We would be able to provide at least 25 percent of the total rice and wheat seeds required annually in the country if we get more financial support to run our seed production project properly.

The BADC and the DAE has provided nearly 50 percent Boro


