### Education gets highest allocation

Education and Technology gets the highest allocation in the budget for the FY 2006-07 as Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman yesterday proposed Tk 11,093 crore in revenue and development budget for the sector.

It is 15.9 percent of the total budgetary allocation and 20 percent higher than the allocation made in the revised budget of the current fiscal year.

# 14 die as motorboat sinks in Sandwip

At least 14 people including eight children and three women drowned as a motorised boat sank in Sandwip Channel at Baro Kumara in Sitakunda yesterday.

Witnesses said the motorboat, MB Imrul Kayesh of Mosharraf of Sandwip, sank as it hit submerged land some 200 yards off Kumira Ghat around 12:30pm.

Survivors alleged the boat was overloaded with over 100 passengers when it left Gupatachhar Ghat in the offshore island of Sandwip around 11:00am.

Over 20 passengers, mostly children and women, were trapped inside the hull and engine room as the boat capsized. The operator of the boat, Zahurul Haq, managed to

Police with the help of locals recovered nine bodies and rescued eight people in their unconscious state. Five of the rescued died on way to hospital and the rest were undergoing treatment.

The dead include Rubel, 12, Robin, 7, and Rima, 10, sons and daughter of Abul Kashem, an education ministry employee from Azimpur in Sandwip; Khaleda Begum, wife of Md Babul of Sharigaite, Kazipara, her son Fahim, 12, and daughter Ishrat Jahan alias Prama, 10; Tanim, 7, and Tamim, 4, sons of Md Babul, an expatriate in Saudi Arabia from Bakhterhat in

Sandwip; Surma Begum, wife of Kamal Uddin of Shiberhat, engine driver of the boat Abul Bashar, 60, Noor Jahan, 35, and her daughter Nazmun Nahar, 3.

The identities of the remaining two could not be known

Hundreds of people rushed to the Kumiraghat, some 25Km off the port city, to see if any of their near and dear ones was among the victims or survivors.

Passengers of the boat and locals alleged absence of the BIWTC-run water vessels forces around 2,000 people cross the channel in a very few number of privately operated engine boats

#### Tax on undeclared money to buy flats, cars upped

The proposed budget has increased the tax on undeclared money used to buy apartments in posh areas, land and cars.

The tax rate has been increased to Tk 300 per square foot for a plinth area up to 200 square metre, which was Tk 200 in the last budget, and Tk 500 from Tk 300 for a plinth area over 200 square metre.

The proposed budget, as per section 19B of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1984, also mentioned the localities to be considered as posh. These include Gulshan, Banani, Baridhara, Bashundhara, Dhanmondi, DOHS etc of Dhaka and Panchlaish and Khulshi of

The budget, however, kept "the prevailing tax rates unchanged for other areas'

#### No duty cut on newsprint

The proposed budget does not have any announcement for reducing duty on newsprint import.

The Newspaper Owners' Association of Bangladesh (Noab) has been demanding for long for reducing duties on newsprint import to a reasonable level. The parliamentary standing committee on information ministry also seconded the Noab's demand

On May 29, editors of different national dailies and press leaders identified the issue of duty on newsprint import, among others, as the key problem before the committee.

The duty on newsprint import in Bangladesh is 25 per cent while the duty in India, Pakistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka and other countries in the region is not more than 5-6 per cent, they mentioned.

### Budget turns blind Chief whip's son held eye to power crisis

The proposed budget has hardly any provision for the improvement of power situation in the near future as it lacks 'vigorous initiative' to address the crisis amid growing demands of the business community and the people.

"An investment to the tune of about Tk 22,000 crore will be needed to build an appropriate power infrastructure," Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman said proposing to allocate Tk 3,586 crore to improve power generation, transmission, and distribution.

The minister said the allocation has been earmarked for 52 projects including two new projects in the ADP during financial year 2006-07.

Experts in the sector said majority of the allocation would go for transmission and distribution of power instead of construction of new power plants. He said the government has involved private sector for power generation.


Investors, factory owners and

workers expressed their relief with the reopening of DEPZ after it was shut down twice due to workers' unrest since May 22.



## Iraqi Qaeda chief Zarqawi killed

Abu Musab al-Zarqawi, al-Qaeda's leader in Iraq who led a bloody campaign of suicide bombings and kidnappings, has been killed in an air raid north of Baghdad a major victory in the US-led war in Iraq and the broader war on terror.

Iraq's prime minister and US officials said his identity was confirmed by fingerprints and a firsthandlook at his face.

The announcement came six days after the Jordanian-born terror leader appeared in a videotape, railing against Shias in Iraq and saying militias are raping women and killing Sunnis and the community must fight back.

Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki said al-Zarqawi was killed along with seven aides Wednesday evening in a house 30 miles northeast of Baghdad in the volatile province of Diyala, just east of the provincial capital of Baqouba, al-Maliki said.

"Today, al-Zarqawi was elimi-nated," al-Maliki told a news conference, drawing loud applause from reporters as he was flanked by US Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad and US Gen. George Casey, the top US commander in Iraq.

Al-Maliki said the air strike was the result of intelligence reports provided to Iraqi security forces by residents in the area, and US forces acted on the information.
