The general consensus after this tournament's first series of matches was that only Argentina, Spain and the Czech Republic had shown the fizz, finesse and fearsome finishing of potential world champions. But on the evidence of Argentina's awesome destruction of Serbia and Montenegro at Gelsenkirchen on Friday, the Spaniards and Czechs will have to up their game considerably if they're to thwart the boys from Buenos Aires.

Jose Pekerman's troops began at a cracking pace and were three up at half-time before adding another three after the break - two of the goals, in particular, being works of rare beauty

Serbia and Montenegro are certainly no mugs - they had conceded only one goal in 10 qualifying matches - but they were dominated from the outset, Argentina forcing two corners in the first

to Saviola with a wonderful flick. The little striker skipped past his marker to lay the ball into the path of the in-rushing Rodriguez, who finished what he'd started by firing first-time past goalkeeper Dragoslav Jevric.

The second goal, after 32 minutes, was even better, concluding a majestic 24-pass move that went the whole length of the pitch. If you had thought that the performance of South American team Ecuador was a flash in the pan, then think again. Ecuador yet again proved their critics wrong by handing out a 3-0 drubbing to Central American rivals Costa Rica in a match that saw them take the lead in Group A. Over in Nuremberg, the English sneaked to a late win over Trinidad and Tobago. And in Berlin, Paraguay were sent packing by a late goal from Freddy Ljunberg.

All eyes were in Nuremberg

however as Trinidad coach Leo Beenhakker looked to pull through the promise he had made to Sven Goran Eriksson of beating the English. And he came very close as well as John Terry had to clear off the line in the end of the first half. The islanders held off English attacks courageously and looked on the verge of a historic draw. However, it was not to be as Peter Crouch made up for his profligacy in front of goal by putting in a thumping header. And Gerrard made the scoreline that much sweeter by curling in a 25-yard left foot effort. It was 2-0 in the end; a result that could be said was unfair to Trinidad & Tobago. The English however will be buoyed by the return of Wayne Rooney and the encouraging performances of Aaron Lennon and David Beckham who had to contend with a right back role near the end. If mathematical permutations work out in favour of the neutral, then we could well be seeing a England-Germany clash in the second round.

ITALY V USA

Wary of backlash

Italy fear that the United States' determination to keep their World Cup hopes alive will make them dangerous opponents here in Saturday's Group Ematch.

The Americans were trounced 3-0 by the Czech Republic in their opening game and are in danger of an early exit, while victory for the Italians could be enough to earn them a last 16 place.

"We won't be underestimating the United States because they have to win against us or they're out," said Andrea Pirlo, scorer of Italy's first goal in their 2-0 win over Ghana, which stretched their unbeaten run to 19 matches.

They were well beaten by the Czechs in their first match, but that will only make them more determined to get the three points. They know that they have to play the game of their lives."

Republic beat the Americans. "I was expecting a closer match because the USA have made giant strides in the last five years," he said. They reached the quarter-finals

of the World Cup four years ago and came here full of confidence. The Italians won their opening Group E game against Ghana 2-0 while Bruce Arena's Americans

suffered a 3-0 loss to Czech Republic in their first outing at these finals. "We can't undervalue the portance of this game," said Italy

forward Alberto Gilardino, "For the United States it will be

the game of their lives given that they lost their opening match against the Czechs and they know that if they mess up again they will be out.

"From our point of view, we have to be focused and very solid in order to get another three points. They are a team that like to keep possession but we have the quality to put them in difficulty," said the AC Milan striker.

Defender Gianluca Zambrotta is in line for a recall for Italy after recovering from the left thigh strain, which kept him out of the Ghana match. Tenacious midfielder Gennaro

Gattuso, also absent against the Ghanaians, is making good progress after feeling a recurrence of a right leg injury and could play some part.
