ERSHAD KAMOL he four-day Lalon Festival '06 ended on June 17. The Department of Music and Dance of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA) arranged the festival at the Plaza of

Department of Fine Arts at its premises. "Over 100 of prominent and upcoming singers such as Farida Parveen, Pagla Bablu, Sameer Baul and others were invited to the festival from different corners of the country as well as institutions such as Department of Theatre and Music, University of Dhaka, and Music College. Another attraction of the festival was the presentation of research papers on Lalon by Dr Tapan Bagchi, Mohsin Hossain and Asafudaullah," asserted Abul Kalam Shafi Ahmed (Shafi Kamal), the director of the

Department of Music and Dance of BSA.

However, the arrangement raised question amongst the viewers.

Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy's

Jamaluddin Bulu, one of the viewers who attended the festival, said, "Like millions of Lalon lovers I came here to listen to the renditions of the mohajans (devotees) from the akhra (den) of Kushtia. I'm concerned about the distortion of Lalon songs, which UNESCO has acclaimed as part of 'Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity'. My aim was to discover the difference between Lalon songs presented by the mohajans and that of the renowned musicians who render songs for the urban ear. But, I'm frustrated when I see so many upcoming urban singers in the festival who are not attuned to Lalon music.'

Shafi Kamal said, "One has to realise the



ambience of a festival. It was not a musical soiree on Lalon songs, in which only selected prominent singers participate. Because of some unavoidable political crisis many of the invited Lalon devotees from Kushtia could not attend To increase the number of the singers for a festival we had to compromise. That's why we invited even the singers of other folk genres who sing Lalon songs. Moreover, our aim is to encourage younger singers."

However, on condition of anonymity, a prominent folk singer who also sings Lalon songs, said, "In my long music career I've never seen Shilpakala do justice to its role as a promoter of the arts. It is evident that at the end of the fiscal year several departments of BSA arrange 'eve wash' festivals to 'utilise' the annual budget (except Department of Fine Arts). Despite being a recognised Lalon as well as folk singer, I was not invited.

The principal objectives of BSA are to represent the cultural heritage of Bangladesh and foster the arts. The activities of the academy include extending patronage to artists, conducting research, arranging art exhibitions and festivals of music and dance at national and international levels. It is imperative that BSA

Cell phone cinematographers make feature debut

The theme may be familiar but the technique is new: A standard cell phone camera to shoot an entire featurelength documentary on love and eroticism.

Italian filmmakers used a Nokia N90, a higher-end cell phone sold around the world, to produce the 93minute Nuovi Comizi D'Amore (New Love Meetings), which they say is the first feature film to be entirely shot with such a tool

"With the widespread availability of cell phones equipped with cameras, anybody could do this," documentary co-director Marcello Mencarini said. "If you want to say something nowadays, thanks to the new media, you can."In news gathering, early footage is often shot with a cell phone, and, in the case of major events, authorities and news outlets have been known to call on amateurs to come through with video. When it comes to movies, though, cell phone cameras present limitations, such as the difficulty to film in darkness or the lack of high-quality microphones.

As a result, the movie mostly features close-ups, and the image, while overall clear when seen on a computer, is slightly shaky. Mencarini said the movie could be viewed on big screens, though "it wouldn't be highdefinition." The movie's directors said no postproduction manipulation was made on the image.

Low costs and greater flexibility were among the reasons why Mencarini and co-director Barbara Seghezzi decided to use a cell phone camera.
