


Exhibition



included in red, orange and blue. A young woman's outstretched hand is also there in the forefront. The other painting has two emerald parrots, talking to each other and fluttering their wings. The background has

swirls of pink, blue and white. Rafiqun Nabi's Rest has a figure seated on a chair. Some other pieces of furniture have been added too. This is done in simple, muted gray strokes. Farida Zaman has a woman done in blue, with slanted eyes, a red teep and black squiggles for her hair. Green and blue washes set off the portrait. Mohammed Eunus' still life has two bottles that appear like old wine casks, with a modern beaker in front. This is in red, brown and black, with touches of white. Abdul Mannan's remarkable landscape has a pearly sky with billowy clouds, along with a huge tree and green and brown foliage. The people included in the composition are bending over and getting on with their daily work of fishing.

Qayyum Chowdhry's painting contains a woman in a blue sari with a red border. Behind are large motifs in pink and blue, which appear at times like flowers and at others like birds and butterflies. In the centre are more depiction of birds and festoons. Alokesh Ghosh's two boats are there with more boats in the backdrop. The sky is a shade of turbulent green and dark blue while the water is aquamarine. Kanak Chanpa Chakma has two paintings. One has two women sitting and working. The backdrop is in gold and contains depiction of water gourds. The other has a standing woman done in pink, black and gray.

Shadat Hussain's creation is abstract and contains squares, rectangles, triangles and semi oval shapes. In places one finds delicate lines done in crayon. Included in the composition is a face of a woman staring

through a window and this is done in black. In Khalid Mahmud Mithu's creation there is a splash of gray as the focal point. At the back is yellow, white and gold. Beyond these one finds green and blue in the forms of geometrical shapes. Added to these are bars and flecks of blue and emerald. Samajit Rai Chowdhury's work has squares of different colours and enmeshed in them is a delicate black net with fish caught in its

Lyrics from a famous Beatles' song

Sir Paul McCartney, the singer who wrote When I'm 64 for The Beatles' Sergeant Pepper album, crossed the 64-year benchmark on June 18. By all reports the former Beatle lay low on his birthday.

While more is known about his life as a member of Beatles, in recent years McCartney had several projects in the pipeline--after his first wife Linda's death, he publicly exhibited his paintings for the first time and released a book of poetry titled Blackbird singing. He has also continued to record and tour, and headlined the Glastonbury Festival in 2004. The grapevine also has it that he and his second wife Heather Mills have parted ways recently.

McCartney was born to a working class family on June 18, 1942 in Liverpool. His father Jim was a gifted musician who played with a jazz band in the evening while working in a day job as a salesman. His mother Mary, was a former nursing sister at the hospital where he was born. Paul was baptised as a Roman Catholic, his mother's faith but religion did not play a major role in his upbringing. Nevertheless, his mother's death from breast cancer at the age of 47, hit him very hard. He referred to her in the lyrics of Let it be --"When I find myself in times of trouble, mother Mary comes to me."

His musical career began soon after her death. Paul got his father to buy him a guitar and learnt to play by emulating American R&B hits he heard on the radio. In October 1957, Paul

1960. Apparently the group got their 'moptop' haircuts in Germany. A turning point was a gig at a nightclub where they encountered Brian Epstein, who offered to become their manager. After one unsuccessful attempt at signing up for a contract with Decca in 1962, Epstein managed to rope in producer George Martin to sign the group to Parlophone Records in 1962 The rest is history--Beatlemania reached its

peak with The Beatles' first single, Love me do and She loves you. Around this time Paul began to date actress Jane Asher. Several Beatles' songs are believed to have been inspired by their relationship, including We can work it out and Here, there and everywhere. The band took America by storm in 1964, after their appearance in the widely viewed Ed Sullivan show

By then The Beatles were beginning to fall apart through musical and personal differences. Paul released his first solo album, McCartney in 1970 around the same time as the last Beatles' song, Let it be. He joined forces with a new group called The Wings. The band's hits included Mull of Kintyre, the James Bond theme for Live and let

Bengal Partition: Reflection on culture

The Partition of Bengal in 1947 was a traumatic event with far reaching emotional and political consequences at personal as well as collective levels of identity formation. It was a crucial event in the history, politics and culture of the South Asian subcontinent. It uprooted millions, leaving the deepest scars in individual and collective memory. Many were forced to abandon the homes that they had lived in for generations. Families were divided, friends and neighbours were left behind, and an immense mass confusion developed as to where to go and what to expect when they got there. All of these factors created tremendous tension which led to the religious hatred, riots and murders.

The overall impact of the Partition on the history, society and culture of the subcontinent is reflected in films and literary

West Bengal. Most of such works deal with the consequences of Partition: particularly the insecurity and anxiety engendered by the homelessness of the refugees of Bengal. They convey how Partition struck at the roots of Bengali

culture. These views were expressed at a seminar on Bengal Partition: Reflection on Culture organised by Rainbow Film Society and United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) on the occasion of the World Refugee Day in the city on June 20. Mofidul Hoque presented the keynote paper while National Professor Kabir Chowdhury presided over the seminar. Poet Naveem Gowhor, filmmaker Badal Rahman and columnist Ali Ahmed were discussants.

Mofidul Hoque pointed out "We have a good number of books expressing the nostalgia and yearning that many Bengalis' have

works from both Bangladesh and for their pre-Partition way of life and the consequences of Partition, but a scholarly objective analysis of Partition is almost absent."

Nayeem Gowhor shared his childhood memories of Partition. Ali Ahmed said "Our generation's general experience is different- we are not as emotionally attached to the Partition as the older generation." He emphasised the need for an authentic history of Partition.

Kabir Chowdhury emphasised on the need to promote pluralistic values and ideas. "Since history will not alter and political unification is impossible, to go forward we must think in terms of cultural integration rather than cultural segregation. Through cultural unity and programmes we can achieve this objective," he said.
