Lankan president due July 12

Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa will pay a three-day visit to Bangladesh from July 12 and hold bilateral talks with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia.

This will be his first visit to Bangladesh since Mahinda assumed the office on November 19, 2005. He is the sixth president of SriLanka

Foreign ministry officials termed the visit of the Sri Lankan new president significant in both bilateral and regional aspects. Bangladesh and Sri Lanka are members of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (Saarc) and Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (Bimstec).

Pry schools kept shut for 6th day

Government primary schools and community primary schools remained closed across the country for the sixth consecutive day yesterday as the pro-Awami League Bangladesh Community Teachers Association remained rigid on their fast until-death programme.

The pro-BNP faction of the teachers' association however called off their strike on Wednesday night following talks with Prime Minister's Political Secretary Harris Chowdhury.

The pro-BNP community primary school teachers, who were on




