Five Sri Lankan sailors were killed and three wounded in an exchange of fire with Tamil Tiger boats in the

The Nordic ceasefire monitoring mission, or SLMM, was thrown into crisis last week when the rebels demanded the removal of observers from European Union members Finland, Sweden and Denmark after the EU outlawed the Tigers.

Norway has maintained that it will continue its mediating efforts, saying withdrawal is not an option.

But this further blow to the peace process has added to anxiety throughout Sri Lanka as the country veers dangerously towards fullscale war.
