Production suspended at **CUFL** for lack of gas supply

Production at Chittagong Urea Fertilizer Limited remained suspended for around six hours on Monday due to an abrupt halt of gas supply.

According to CUFL sources, an interruption in gas supply caused suspension of fertilizer production at the factory at 7:15pm.

They further said that with the flow of gas supply remaining below the required level, CUFL could not go into full production till yesterday afternoon. They could only produce 812 M tons of fertilizer yesterday while the normal daily production is some 1700 M tons, they added.

However, the officials of Bakharabad Gas Supply Limited claimed that no incident of sudden interruption in gas supply was reported till Monday.

The reported interruption in gas supply at CUFL probably happened due to a problem in its internal supply line, said a BGSL

Bullet-hit city trader dies in hospital

A trader of Sabujbagh, who was shot by miscreants last month for refusing to pay extortion, succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medial College and Hospital (DMCH) on Monday night.

Being furious at his death news, locals staged a demonstration at Sabujbagh in the city after his janaza demanding trial and exemplary punishment of the killers.

On June 12, local hoodlums Wasim, Ripon and their gang shot Delwar Hossain, 25, owner of Pardo Medicine House in Manda in Sabujbagh, at his head, said family members of the victim.

He was admitted to DMCH where he died on Monday night after about one-month fighting for life.

Family members alleged that local hoodlum Uzzal demanded Tk 1 lakh from Delwar

As he refused to pay them the amount, the miscreants killed him

MAZEDA MURDER

Ex-husband, 3 others get 31 years' RI

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced an ex-husband and three others to 31 years' rigorous imprisonment for killing Mazeda Begum, a housewife at Savar, in June 1998.

The convicts are ex-husband Badsha Miah alias Lal Badsha and his brother Mohammad Ali, sons of late Abdul Hamid, and Khokan Miah, son of Mohammad Ali, and Shahjahan, son of Sumon Bepari, of Ghaserdia.

Judge Kamrul Hossain Mollah of the Fifth Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court handed down the sentence in their absence. The court also acquitted Abdur Rahman and Afsar Uddin, as the charges brought against them were

not proved. The punishment of the fugitives will be effective from the day of their arrest or surrender, the judge said.

Earlier, the prosecution and the defence completed their arguments and the court recorded statements of 23 prosecution witnesses.

According to the prosecution, a gang of miscreants led by Lal Badsha called Mazeda Begum out of her house at Maniknagar in Savar at about 8:00pm on June 1 and killed her as she married another person when Lal Badhsa was

A murder case was filed with Savar Police Station accusing Lal Badsha and five others the same day.

Agri officials asked to raise quality seed production

Agriculture Minister MK Anwar yesterday asked agriculture officials to take up more projects to increase quality seed production, expand rrigation coverage and reduce the 'yield gap'.

The minister was addressing a meeting aimed at preparing a roadmap ensuring full and timely implementation of the development projects under the Annual Development Program of 2006-07, said a press release.

The agriculture ministry will implement 55 spill-over projects at a cost of Tk. 580 crore under the current ADP. Another Tk. 641 crore has been allocated for 62 new projects which are at different stages of approval.

Member of the Planning Division Ali Imam Mazumder, Agriculture Secretary Kazi Abul Kashem, chief executives of all the 16 agriculture organisations, representatives of the Ministries concerned and officials of the agriculture ministry attended the

Emphasising the need for successful implementation of the development projects, the minister said, "you will have to make forward planning to implement different components of the projects. Don't wait for fund release to start the work under the projects". The minister said quality seed

supply should be strengthened to increase production. He said, "we will have to take steps to reduce loss of irrigation water, apart from expansion of irrigation coverage". He asked the BADC and Barind Multipurpose Development Authority to take a coordinated approach to increase irrigation facilities uniformly across the coun-

The minister also said research and extension organisations should take coordinated steps to reduce huge yield-gap, which is above 30 percent in some crops. The meeting decided to increase

seed storage capacity of BADC. It also decided to expedite research on all fibre crops such as jute and cotton at one place.

FIRST SEDITION CASE

Charges not framed against 8 JMB leaders, activists

A Dhaka court could not frame charges of the first sedition case against eight JMB leaders and activists of Dhamrai area, as the lone accused Rafiqul Islam alias Sentu, now in jail, was not produced before it yesterday due to hartal.

Judge Mohammad Golam Hossain of the Additional District Judge and Bankruptcy Court fixed August 3 for the next hearing and directed the jail authorities to produce Sentu before the court on that

day.
The accused are Mohammad Rafigul Islam alias Sentu, 22, Mohammad Wahab, 26, Yaqub Ali, 21, Anwar Hossain, 23, Farug Hossain Wahiduzzaman alias Pintu. 20. Abdus Salam, 22, and Nurul Islam, 23. Of them, Sentu is now in custody while the others are still at large.

Sub-Inspector (SI) Iqbal Hossain. also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, submitted the charge sheet on December 27 last year against the accused to a first class magistrate's court in the city, showing 25 people as prosecution witnesses.

On February 20, 2005 Dhamrai police arrested Sentu, Wahab, Yaqub, Anwar, Faruq and Salam with nine manuals on bomb making and other contraband materials on the Dhaka-

They showed the six men arrested under Section 54 of the Criminal

Procedure Code and produced them before a first class magistrate's court in Dhaka on February 22, 2005 with prayer for a seven-day remand to nterrogate them. The court granted a two-day remand. Thirteen days into their arrest, the

arrestees were released on bail. Investigating the case, Dhamrai police found that the activities of the ccused were seditious. With approval from the home

ministry, SI Zehad Hossain of the police station filed the sedition case against the accused on September 11

Sentu was re-arrested in November while the others have been absconding.
