French authorities have been cracking down on World Cup related violence, Friday, dishing out prison sentences to young hooligans. A French football fan received a

four-month prison sentence for throwing a bottle at a police officer after his country reached the World Cup final.

The 19-year-old man launched the missile at a police chief in Cavaillon following France's 1-0 World Cup semi-final victory against Portugal.

He denied the incident and claimed to have been a victim of police violence, but was found guilty by a court in Avignon.

Meanwhile, three youngsters from Marseille were also handed prison sentences after a night of violence in the port town following France's semi-final win.

Gangs threw missiles at CRS officers and 15 youths were arrested, with two repeat offending minors receiving three months in prison, while a Marseille court gave

Former Juventus coach Fabio Capello is set to try to sign three players from the ailing Italian giants for his new club Real Madrid, it was reported on Saturday.

Capello, who guit earlier this week to take the helm at Real Madrid for a second time, wants to lure Italian captain Fabio Cannavaro, fellow defender Gianluca Zambrotta and Brazilian defensive midfielder Emerson according to the sports dailies As and Marca.

According to the papers negotiations between the two clubs began on Friday over the trio --Cannavaro and Zambrotta are still in Germany preparing for Sunday's World Cup final -- who will in Marca's opinion apparently cost 15million euros.

However, As disagrees and according to its contacts it will be a loan deal with the players returning to the 'Old Lady' should they be promoted to Serie A at the end of next season - the club also would prefer that none of the players go to rival clubs, with Zambrotta already interesting AC Milan.

Juventus look set to be demoted from Serie A after their lawyers said earlier this week that they were prepared to accept their punishment over the match-fixing scan-

Juve rattled league rivals Lazio, AC Milan and Fiorentina by announcing on Wednesday they would accept relegation to the second division and a points deduction for their role in the alleged scam.

"The acceptable sanction, let's say forced but acceptable, is that proposed for the other teams ... that's to say, the second division with penalty points," Juventus lawyer Cesare Zaccone told the sports tribunal.

The prosecutor in the Italian Football Federation (FIGC) hearing has demanded Juve be dropped to the third division with the loss of six points and stripped of its last two league titles.

He has proposed that the other three be relegated to the second division next season, with AC Milan losing three points, and Lazio and Fiorentina 15 points each -- 13 of the World Cup finalists squad play for the clubs involved, though none


