# Awareness, facilities help detect more premature babies

An infant lies inside a brightly lit incubator in ward no.3 of the Dhaka Children Hospital (DCH), while being fed with breast milk through nasal tubes and intravenous saline.

His eyes are bandaged as protection from the phototherapy rays being given for jaundice.

"We have not named him yet as he is still too little," said his aunt who was tending to him as his mother was ill.

There is an increasing presence of premature babies and infants with congenital diseases in the present generation, said hospital

"They are actually not increasing but more are being detected due to increased awareness and facilities available," said Dr Md Salim Shakur, director, senior consultant and member of the management board of DCH and also a professor of the Bangladesh Institute of Child

He added that there has been no significant reduction in premature and low weight infants since the last decade although infant mortality has reduced to a certain extent but not significantly.

A premature baby is one that is born in less than 37 weeks of pregnancy whereas a low weight infant is one that weighs less than 2.5 kilograms. The purpose of incubators is to maintain a certain level of temperature and humidity,

provide oxygen and prevent infections in such infants.

Congenital diseases refer to the improper development of the heart, brain, liver or any other organ that ultimately leads to physical or mental impairment or any other disease. Minor congenital diseases refer to conditions like cleft lips or cleft palates.

"Congenital diseases are formed in the infant within the womb, depending on the mother's eating habits whereas acquired diseases are those acquired by an infant after birth depending on what the infant is fed with," explained Shakur.

He focused on air pollution in urban areas apart from the tendency of urban women towards drugs; alcoholism and smoking that could affect unborn babies.

Responding to a question, he said that contraceptive pills have no side effects but consumption of adulterated food containing toxic chemicals could lead to congenital diseases in unborn infants. Infants fed with adulterated food and kept in unhealthy environments could acquire diseases, he added.

"Although there is no direct evidence, chronic consumption of fast food containing various chemicals could affect the organs of unborn infants," he

Even medications for diabetes, blood pressure or schizophrenia could have similar effects if they are taken without a doctor's advice." he

There is also no direct evidence that chemical fertilisers used in agriculture could lead to congenital or acquired diseases in infants.

The mother's mental stress could lead to a hyperactive infant both in and out of the womb, said Shakur. Such

infants can suffer from colic and inadequate sleep after birth.

"A mother's mental nature could lead to inadequate breast milk," said a female doctor, preferring anonymity and citing her own experience as a mother. She also added that newborn babies could acquire infections from each other when

they are kept in the same ward. "Brain defects in the infant

can occur due to complicated deliveries," said the doctor, citing the case of a woman carrying an infant who had a brain defect from birth.

She explained it as situations in normal deliveries where the birth canal is too small or an infant is too large to pass through. Consequently a newborn baby cannot take the first breath. She also cited the cases of

mothers who are not taken to hospitals immediately after they experience labour pains.

"Many elderly women are now conceiving through artificial stimulation like using certain form of drugs and infants born to such women are often premature," she added.

A caesarean operation, where a baby delivered by cutting open the abdomen, is required in situations where the infant is already matured within the womb and vet the mother

does not experience labour

Caesarean infants are prone to respiratory problems as they cannot squeeze out the fluid inside their bodies unlike infants in normal deliveries who squeeze it out as they pass out through the womb." said



# Rajuk accepts late appeal in approving plan

Rajuk's appellate authority has decided to restore a building plan, cancelled in March this year, hearing the appeal three and a half months after the cancellation order that raised question about the fairness of the appeal process.

As per rules, any one aggrieved by an action of Rajuk's building construction (BC) committee is supposed to go to the appellate authority within 30

The plot owner in this case first filed a writ petition in the High Court and after three and a half months he approached the appellate authority of Rajuk (Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha)

which entertained the appeal. The BC committee-2

approved the plan on February 2, 2006 for construction of a 15storey commercial and residential building by Prasad Nirman Ltd. But it cancelled the plan on March 15 on the allegation that the builders "suppressed facts and made false declaration in the proposed construction plan."

Rajuk chairman KAM Harun, as convenor of the appellate committee, held the appeal hearing on July 3 in which representative of Department of Architecture was absent.
