Having been loaned out to Milan two years ago he is now eager to secure a switch back to the San Siro, and is hopeful of his chances.

Sources suggest that Crespo's agent, Fernando Hidalgo, is to talk with Chelsea bosses about the possibility of a departure.

The Argentine is believed to be keen on severing his ties with the Stamford Bridge side and returning to The Rossoneri on a permanent basis.

He is even ready to accept a pay cut, while Milan would undoubtedly welcome him back with open arms.

In the wake of Andriv Shevchenko's arrival Chelsea may be sympathetic to Crespo's plight and deem him expendable, but they are not likely to let him go

"He wants to play for us," said Rummenigge, adding agreeing on a transfer fee was the only aspect of the move that needed to be tied up.On Wednesday, sports daily Marca claimed Nistelrooy's move to Real Madrid stalled because the Spanish club were offering 14 million euros and United wanted 18 million.

United boss Ferguson said last week that 30-year-old Nistelrooy had asked to leave the club.

Van Nistelrooy lost his first team place at Old Trafford at the end of last season and did not appear for Holland in their World Cup second round match against Portugal.

The Dutchman has scored 95 goals in 150 matches for United since joining from PSV Eindhoven in


Corradi, 30, agreed a three-year contract after being told he could leave the Spanish club and joins City a year after turning down a move to the English Premiership

O'Leary retired as a Leeds player in 1995 due to injury following an illustrious career with Arsenal for whom he made 722 appearances. He was capped 68 times by Ireland.

But World Cup-winner Buffon, 28 and influential playmaker Nedved have both indicated they are willing to stay and help the


beleaguered Turin club. Buffon's agent Silvano Martina said: "Gigi is staying with Juventus.

"He's ready to play in Serie B. There was a bid from Roma to take him on loan but Juve didn't con-

The club's talismanic striker Alessandro Del Piero had already said he does not want to leave and former Lazio star Nedved is also expected to stay.

EPL tops Scholes' agenda

Paul Scholes insists Manchester United must mount a serious challenge for the Premiership title this season after admitting that the club have waited too long to secure domestic dominance.

Scholes, 31, is currently proving his fitness on United's tour of South Africa after missing five months of last season with a blurred vision problem affecting his right eye. And with Chelsea having won

the last two Premiership campaigns, former England midfielder Scholes claims that United are determined to return to the summit of English football.

Scholes said: "We've won a lot in the past, but that doesn't matter anymore. It's what happens now that is important. We want to win the title every season and we want the title back

"It isn't nice to see Chelsea pick the trophy up, so winning the Premiership is more important than winning the Champions League for me. The Champions League is big, but being English and with the Premiership being so massive, think we have to concentrate on

"We have said for the last two seasons that this is the year we are going to catch Chelsea, though, and we haven't managed it. We can only hope we do it this season."

Although Scholes admits that his eyesight has yet to recover fully, the United stalwart is confident that he can still play a key role for the club and he admits that he is desperate for the new season to start. Scholes said: "The eye is almost

back to normal I suppose. It's not 100 percent of what it was, but there's no problem as far as playing is concerned. It's going to take time to adjust to playing again, but I will be able to do that. "Things are much better now

and I'm really looking forward to the new season. I'm enjoying getting ready for it because for so long, was doing virtually nothing and hardly any exercise. I just sat at home doina nothina.

"I am looking forward to it and am just as determined as ever to win trophies.'
