



This school will be the 5th in the chain of UCEP Technical Schools (under mainstream programs) throughout Bangladesh. The technical schools of UCEP have been recognized to impart market oriented skill development training of a high standard suited to the requirements of the region.

We are sure the new school will fulfill the needs of the growing industrialization of the Rajshahi industrial belt. This technical school will also be a beacon of hope for a better life for the poor underprivileged children of Rajshahi and their families

There was a dire need for establishment of a technical school at Rajshahi which could not be established so long. But now with the special grant of DFID Bangladesh a new technical

UCEP-Rajshahi Technical School

Rajshahi the 4th largest city of Bangladesh is located at the north western part of the country and is established which went into operation in July 2006. At the present moment all students of UCEP one of the divisional headquarters of Bangladesh with rich historical and cultural heritage. It is us for its silk industries and a variety of tropical fruits especially mangoes.

Riggoan has lagged behind in industrial development so long. But with the opening of the Jamuna Bridge and the government drive for industrialization of the northern region new factories and industries are opening up and economic activities are increasing day by day in the region.

The per capita income of the people of Rajshahi is pretty low in comparison to the cities of Dhaka, Chittagong and Khulna. There is a significant number of working children who are out of schools or training institutions in the region.

UCEP established two general schools in Rajshahi in the year 1995 to impart education to the working children up to grade VIII following which a Para-trade Training Center (PTC) was established in 1999 to impart skills training to the graduates of the General Schools.

In response to the demand of community, the needs and desire of the working children two new General Schools and another Para-trade Training Center was set up in July 2005.

The requirement of a full fledged technical school was strongly felt with the growing industrial development in Rajshahi and other cities of the region. The short duration para trade training courses imparted by the PTCs mostly on traditional trades were not able to meet the growing

By the end of project phase IV (June 2004), UCEP was operating 30 general schools, 3 technical

schools and 6 para-trade training centers in the mainstream program. At this stage the capacity of the technical schools was not sufficient to accommodate all the general school graduates and hence a large number of the graduates were being offered the short duration skills training in the Para-trade Training Centers. The desire of the general schools students to be enrolled in the long duration courses of the

technical school along with the growing demand of the employers for graduates of UCEP technical schools rather than the para-trade graduates made it imperative that the capacity of UCEP technical schools be increased to accommodate more general school graduates. This need was communicated to the Development Partners in the beginning of the project phase V in July 2004. In response DFID came forward with a special grant of 1 million pound sterling for

expansion and upgrading of technical education of UCEP programs. Accordingly, the capacities of

all the technical schools have been increased and a new Technical School at Rajshahi has been

general schools after completing grade VIII are being offered the long duration courses of Technical

Rajshahi Technical School is established with an intake capacity of 160 students per session (six months) and in future SSC, Vocational program will be introduced to enhance the technical education level of the students of UCEP in Rajshahi. The trades and admission capacity of Rajshahi Technical School are as follows:

The duration of education and training for all trades is one year and after full-fledged operation of the technical school a total of 320 students will have opportunity to receive technical education. With the establishment of Rajshahi Technical School, about 42 staff have been employed and most of them are with technical background and skilled to impart technical education.

The objective of this technical school is to provide high quality technical education so that students can compete and enter the job market in the country and abroad.

The Advisory Council and Employers Committee consisting of 11 and 19 members respectively from different sectors like employers, educationists, curriculum specialists and technical experts of the society have already been formed to advise the school to make its programs effective and market-oriented. The members of the Advisory Council and Employers Committee are a group of local volunteers who will meet on a regular basis to provide advice and other support services to the training program for its continued development and relevance to its stakeholders.

Rajshahi Technical School will follow its own curriculum developed in consultation with employers and technical experts like other technical schools of UCEP to make its programs meaningful and job oriented. The establishment of RTS has fulfilled a long-felt desire and need of the underprivileged children of Rajshahi.

UCEP-Bangladesh: A Beacon of Hope

Starting in 1972 at the Dhaka University premises with only 60 students, it is now a hub of around 26 thousand working the next couple of years. children striving to inculcate marketable skills and provide employment support service UCEP SME Credit Program: UCEP introduced SME Credit Program in June 2005 for selfthrough general education and vocational training in close collaboration with industries and employment of the UCEP graduates. About 300 UCEP graduates are enjoying loan facilities roughout Bangladesh. The main objective of the UCEP programs is to improve the socio-economic status of the urban poor and support industrial growth by generating skilled/semi-skilled manpower. UCEP has global reputation for its unique model of human resource development. UCEP's success has enabled it to be listed twice in the UN ESCAP's "Compendium of Centers of Excellence in HRD Research and Training".

UCEP operates 32 General Schools, 5 Technical Schools and 9 Para-Trade Training Centers in personal and business loan for UCEP students and others concerned. Dhaka, Chittagong Khulna and Rajshahi. UCEP also runs 2 other Technical Schools and an Advocacy Program under special projects with Plan-Bangladesh and Manusher Jonno respectively. A new program in collaboration with the government has recently been launched under which UCEP will implement a skills training program in the 'model' of UCEP for the children of Shishu Kallyan Trust (SKT), a program of Reaching Out of School (ROSC) Project under the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education.

General Education: UCEP general schools follow the curriculum and textbooks prescribed by the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB) and provide basic education up to Grade VIII. Student Attendance and Dropout rates in UCEP general schools were 94% and 3.3% respectively in 2005-2006. UCEP General Education Component launched SSC program under Bangladesh Open University (BOU) in 2005 and 296 students have already been enrolled for this program.

Vocational Education: UCEP students, upon completion of general school education, are promoted to vocational education either in technical schools or in short duration para-trade training centers. Vocational education component started SSC (Voc.) Program under Bangladesh Technical Education Board (BTEB) from January 2005.

Technical Schools: To provide appropriate skills and thereby improve the employment prospects of General School graduates, UCEP provides Technical Education through its 5 Technical Schools in Dhaka, Chittagong, Khulna and Rajshahi. The training centers offer hands-on vocational training in 17 trades all based on the demand of the contemporary employment market. Attendance and dropout rates in the technical schools were 97% and

1.26% respectively in 2005-2006. 
