Man's best friend with sense of law-abiding duty

Canine potential is largely underestimated in local society, but the canines of the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) dog squad would prove the extent of canine efficiency that goes beyond humans.

Originating in 2004 from a section of the police dog squad for security and detecting explosives, arms and narcotics, the Rab dog squad comprise of Labradors and German shepherds of both genders. The Labradors are of British origin while the German shepherds are German.

"These species have a detecting by smell capacity from a distance of 10 to 15 metres and a depth of two feet unlike local species," said Captain Md. Mizanur Rahman, assistant director of the squad, adding that the dogs could jump up three to

An average adult German shepherd is 62-65 cm tall and weigh between 35-40 kg whereas an average adult Labrador is 55 cm tall and weigh between 28-30 kg. The life span of a dog is 12-15 years. The breeding season is between March-April and September-October. A female can give birth to 6-8 puppies

Training begin when the dogs are six months. Initially they are familiarised to the smell of food and gradually to explosives, arms and narcotics. Individual dogs specialise in a single type of smell. Scratching at a specific location indicates that

Males and females are segregated after breeding as excessive breeding could lead to a lower efficiency level. Cross breeding is restricted for the same

Dogs on the verge of retirement or suffering from incurable diseases are disposed through euthanasia and the deceased dogs are buried in a graveyard within the premises.

There are 46 dogs, 40 kennels, 12 trainers and two veterinarians at present. Each kennel has a fan and an attached balcony to ensure air, sunlight and walking space.

The fans ensure a certain level of temperature, as the dogs are accustomed to living in cold climates. They are subjected to

regular medical check ups and bathed after 15 days and kennels

Local nutritionists devise the canine diet comprise of bread, eggs, cod liver oil, boiled meat and vegetables. Every dog is fed according to age, weight and height. Puppies that do not have access to the mother's milk are fed with formulated canine milk. The dogs also have individual

names engraved on their collars. A Rab oficer was seen chasing Boxy, a German shepherd of five-months, who was out of a leash. Poppet, an eight-year old Labrador, barked at this correspondent but quietened after an officer cautioned her and said 'no' in an assuring tone.

"They do not bite unless we ask

them to," said a Rab officer and explained it as gesturing at a targeted individual and uttering 'attack'. Jess, another an eight-year old Labrador, was being treated for skin disease at the vet clinic.

Training begin when the dogs are six months. Initially they are familiarised to the smell of food and gradually to explosives, arms and narcotics. Individual dogs specialise in a single type of smell. Scratching at a specific location indicates that something has been detected.

A dog's day begins at 5:30 am when they are served breakfast. They are exercised between 6:00 and 6:40 and then groomed and rested. By 8:00 am, the adult dogs go out on duty at various locations while the pups stay behind

The harness on their backs gives the dogs a hint that they are on active duty.

woken up in the middle of the night for the sake of duty," said Rahman. Sterilization is not yet being implemented as the authorities

intend to increase the number of dogs. "We imported 10 German shepherds and we intend to bring

more Labradors to produce pure breeds," Rahman added.

plot winner and a Samity leader seeking anonymity.

"They make such claims just to save their skin," he added.

Corruption, financial misappropriation, irregularities and lack of commitment reign over this housing project, he said.

"Certain officials manage to get posted to this project just to make money or grab a plot by whatever means," he further

There is no legal expertise to take care of various legal aspects particularly in matter of land acquisition, he said, adding that a legal expert may put an end to raging malpractice on the project.

A top Raiuk official termed its chairman's expectation of handing over 1.000 plots by October as a fantasy

"A major reason behind delay in project implementation is the inefficiency of the project director (PD)," said the Rajuk official. "PD for such township development projects is usually employed from Rajuk. But in this case, the PD has come from the public Works department (PWD)," he added.

The present PD is the third. Two previous PDs of Purbachal, also from PWD, were simply removed on charges of inefficiency and irregularities, with no punishment, he said.

But a PD employed from Rajuk would have to explain his failure and face punishment.

Rajuk sources said that project officials are too busy making a business out of plot allotment They indulge in buying low-priced plots meant for affected residents in the project area and then sell them at a higher price to some other buvers.

Though affected residents within the project area have been compensated accordingly, the PD has not been able to evict many of the occupants.

When asked about the project progress Abdus Sadeq, the PD said: "It is strictly prohibited to divulge any information to the

Regarding the allegations against him, Sadeq said: "May be someone wants this position. I certainly have no longing for this post."

"The more one works the more allegations will be" he added.

"Why should we evict those that we don't need to?" he said, "We have employed an NGO to move the duly-compensated occupying inhabitants elsewhere and undertake work on some rehabilitation programmes for them," he said. The Purbachal project, about

16 kilometres away from the city, is located between Rupaani of Narayanganj district and Kaliganj of Gazipur district. There are plots of 10, 7.5, 5

and 3 katha plots on the project. Government price of each of 10-katha plots is Tk 20 lakhs, 7.5-katha Tk12.37 lakhs, 5katha iss Tk 8.05 and 3-katha

plots Tk 4.5 lakhs respectively. Rajuk has so far allotted 12,549 3-katha plots, 1,044 5katha plots, 1,556 plots of 7.5katha and 1,156 10-katha plots.

Believed to be the largest planned housing and urbanisation project in the country, uncertainty looms over Purbachal's utility service systems with still Rajuk negotiating with the agencies concerned to take respon-

"If the killers are not arrested and punished, they may kill my younger son too," Khaer said adding that unknown callers threatened his family of dire consequences if they raised voice about Masum's death.

Khaer mentioned a dispute with Igbal Hossain Likhon, chairman of Nilkomol union of Charfashion upazila in Bhola. He alleged that Likhon and someone in Dhaka may have used Detective Branch (DB) men to kill Masum to take revenge on his family. The father wonders whether a Tk 26.9 lakh money suit brought by him against Likhon and some police officials might be a reason behind his son's death.

He added that a fair investigation cannot be carried out without arresting the prime accused Igbal Hossain Likhon, chairman of Nilkamal Union Parishad in Charfashion of Bhola, and nine personnel of the then DB-4.
