VOTER LIST EC finally gets truncated fund



Two weeks after the Election Commission (EC) Secretariat's proposal for a fund of Tk 40.86 crore for updating the voter list, the finance ministry yesterday allocated Tk 25 crore.

The allocated amount is inadequate for conducting the huge task of updating the existing voter list, Secretary of the EC Secretariat Abdur Rashid Sarkar said, adding, "We will have to seek money again as it is not possible to complete the task with the allocated amount."

The finance ministry will have to allocate more money, which is required for completing the constitutional task of preparing the voter list, he said.

"We disbursed the money...but we put conditions and asked the EC Secretariat to implement the project of updating the voter list in

Rouf, 42, during his arrest in Faridur in 2003, admitted that he had received military training in Pakistan and participated in the previous war in Afghanistan against the erstwhile Soviet Union.

# Alliance fever sidelines electoral reform talks

The much talked about electoral reforms have been sidelined by the latest politics of expanding electoral alliances, prompting political analysts to believe that the possibility of brining the reforms is slim during the tenure of the four-party alliance government.

With a new election around the corner, neither the government nor the Election Commission (EC) has any plan at this moment to bring reforms in the EC and electoral

Sensing ruling BNP's strategy to pass the buck to the interim government, Awami League-led 14party opposition coalition is now planning to realise the demand for reforms during the tenure of the next caretaker government, sources said

No remarkable progress has yet taken place in bringing reforms in the caretaker government system, EC and the electoral laws in the last five months since the opposition placed the reform proposals in the

The ruling and opposition parties could not sit for a dialogue over the issue as they could not form a committee to deal with the proposals despite exchanging several letters in the last four

The prevailing stand-off over electoral reforms has prompted many political analysts to believe that the tenure of the current gov ernment will expire in October this year without resolving the issue.

## Edible oil turns too pricey in fortnight

Syndicate cashes in on slight price rise in int'l market


Prices of the edible oil, spice, pulse and some import-based essentials shot up in the city markets as a syndicate of importers and wholesalers allegedly manipulated the market on the pretext of recent unrest in the Middle East.

Prices of soybean oil went up by Tk 12 and palm oil by Tk 14 a litre in SEE PAGE 15 COL 8 | the retail market within a span of 15

days, and traders accused a syndicate of the market manipulation. Some spices and essentials were also turning costlier everyday because of this syndicate, traders at different retail market alleged.

Soybean oil was sold at Tk 55-60 and palm oil at Tk 48-52 a litre in the retail market yesterday. Retail oil prices are Tk 2-3 more than the wholesale market ones but vary,
