French club Lens have criticised UEFA's decision to admit Milan to the Champions League, but will not appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport. The French outfit, who finished

fourth in Ligue 1 last term, had argued they should replace scandal-hit Milan after UEFA decided to further study the Rossoneri's position on ethical grounds.

Director general Francis Collado was furious after Wednesday's final verdict was confirmed, finding the reasons behind why UEFA failed to kick out the Italian outfit hard to digest "UEFA's statement says that

Milan were admitted only because of an insufficient legal basis in the regulations," he said. "Where are the ethics?

"The Italian Football Federation organised a strange scheme to have Milan admitted in the Champions League, when it is clear they were responsible, as well as others, of in some way fixing the championship," he added. Lens President Gervais Martel

bilia being put up for auction by FIFA. World soccer's governing body are giving fans around the globe the chance to own a piece of soccer history. "The first favourites are already emerging," said Jan Broeker, director at the auction house Dechow, which gives interested buyers the chance to inspect items and tender advance bids for

their favourite lot over their Web site. "Demand has been highest for anything with an autograph on it," he

added. The auction includes a wide range of lots from German national coach Juergen Klinsmann's warmup suit to players' sweat-stained jerseys, or even the 32 qualifying

nations' flags hoisted during matches Even the potted plants that adorned the media centres at the 12 World Cup venues are being auctioned off.

"We even have the original goal posts from the opening game in Munich during which our squad scored four goals against Costa Rica," said Broeker. The auction -- the proceeds of

which will go toward a range of nonprofit projects -- will be split in six locations where lots stemming from the surrounding World Cup stadiums will be sold

Broeker has his own personal favourite. "I would love to sit with the boys on the bench Klinsmann and his assistants sat on in my garden, have a few beers and watch some Bundesliga games," he said.

"But unfortunately I don't think I have the space.'

Bayern's general manager Uli Hoeness insisted that the club had chosen to drop out of the race for Van Nistelrooy.
