Khulna people threaten to stop power bill payment

Rally gives Aug 21 deadline to ensure smooth supply

Braving rains, several thousand people marched streets of Khulna city and held a big rally yesterday, where civil society leaders urged the government to resolve the persisting power crisis in south-western region by August 21 and threatened of stopping bill payment for noncompliance.

The rally resolved that tougher agitation will be launched if specific steps are not taken for smooth power supply and to meet other demands of the people of south-western districts by the deadline.

Khulna Bidyut Adhikar Sangram Parishad (KBASP), a civic body

At least 10 students were injured as activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Jatiyabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) clashed over establishing supremacy at Khagrachhari Government College yesterday.

Diploma engrs reject power

co's pay scale

Diploma engineers of Power Development Board (PDB) working under the West Zone Power Distribution Company Limited (WZPDCL) have rejected the pay scale offered by the company, terming it discriminatory.

At a rally on WZPDCL office compound at Boyra on Thursday, they also urged the company to announce a new pay scale with more benefits.

A large number of diploma engineers working under WZPDCL in 21 districts of Khulna and Barisal divisions and greater Faridpur district attended the rally, chaired by Shukhan Roy, convenor of Khulna Regional Committee of PDB Diploma Engineer's Association (DEA).

They said they will paralyse WZPDCL if the recently announced pay scale is not cancelled and a new one with more financial benefits and job security is not announced.
