India's capital New Delhi and financial hub Mumbai raised security yesterday amid US warnings of possible al-Qaeda attacks.

One day after Britain said it had foiled a major plot to bomb trans-Atlantic airliners, the US embassy said militants may be planning a series of blasts in the run-up to Independence Day next Tuesday.

"The embassy has learned that foreign terrorists, possibly including members of al-Qaeda, allegedly intend to carry out a series of bombing attacks in or around New Delhi and Mumbai in the days leading up to India's Independence Day," the embassy said in a statement on its

Indian cities Terror Plot in Britain

19 identified, bank accounts frozen

British officials identified 19 of the suspects accused of plotting to blow up US-bound aircraft on Friday, making public a list of names that fuelled suspicions of a Pakistan connection. Travellers at Britain's airports again struggled with increased security, and dozens more flights were cancelled.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday sent letters to the leaders of five permanent members of the UN Security Council (UNSC) and the UN secretary general calling for immediate and unconditional

ceasefire in Lebanon. In her letters to US President George Bush, British Prime Minister Tony Blair, French President Jacques Chirac, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Chinese President Hu Jintao and UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, Khaleda expressed Bangladesh's deepest concern over the grave crises which threaten to destabilise the whole Middle East region.
