Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) has decided to slap a penalty of Tk 12.5 lakh on the BGMEA for constructing its 15storey office building in the city's Begunbari canal area before obtaining approval for the construction plan, sources said.

"The Building Construction (BC) committee-4 has determined a penalty of Tk 12.5 lakh that BGMEA has to pay to obtain approval for the plan," said a highly placed source. "This includes Tk 12 lakh approval fee at penalty rate and Tk 50,000 fine."

The BC committee members have endorsed the decision unanimously. "We will inform the BGMEA authorities of our decision in a letter on Sunday (today)," said authorised officer of the BC committee Muzaffar Uddin when asked about the decision.

Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) now has to meet three conditions to obtain approval from Rajuk for the building plan that it had previously submitted, Muzaffar said.
