17 projects okayed 'hurriedly' despite flaws in many bids

The Cabinet Purchase Committee yesterday rejected procurement proposals for two projects including a water treatment plant for Chittagong Wasa, and directed the authorities concerned to put out the contracts to re-tender due to irregularities in the previous bidding processes.

The purchase committee meeting chaired by Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman, however, approved 17 other projects, despite many of those being identified as irregular, sources said.

Members of the committee rejected a LGRD ministry proposal for awarding a Tk 64 crore contract to local DCL & Associates for setting up a water treatment plant for Chittagong Wasa, according to

Playing politics with education

The government's decision to acknowledge Qawami madrasa education system yesterday kicked up an uproar all around, with academics, politicians and civil society members terming it a rash political decision designed only to make the Islamic parties in the ruling alliance happy

The government did not even bother to evaluate the quality of education in the Qawami madrasa and upgrade Fazil-Kamil curriculum and syllabi before settling for this controversial decision, said sources at the education ministry.

They alleged that the ruling party BNP caved in to the mounting pressure from its coalition Jamaat-e-Isalami, who rallied for Fazil-Kamil degree to be

made equivalent to bachelormaster's degree-- and Islami Oikya Jote (IOI), who were out to realise recognition for the Qawami educa-

Eminent academic Prof Serajul Islam Choudhury warned of dire consequence for this controversial decision. "Students in the general education system will now be deprived socially, academically and professionally," he told The

Former adviser to caretaker government Hafizuddin Khan was all too surprised at the hasty government move. "I don't know about this system and what they teach," he said. "But this indeed would create more confusion in our flawed education system."

Awami League (AL) yesterday commemorated the second anniversary of the gruesome August 21 grenade attack, taking a fresh vow to bring the perpetrators to book.

The opposition leaders and workers stood in a two-minute silence, lit candles, placed wreaths and brought out mourning processions to match the solemnity of the

As the clock struck 5.22pm, exact time of the first blast, tens of thousands of people stood up and observed silence till 5:24pm in memory of the leaders and activists perished in the blasts that rattled the entire nation.

Leader of the Opposition Sheikh Hasina narrowly escaped the attack on August 21, 2004 but 24 leaders and workers including
