While many lawyers are protesting the appointment of 17 new judges ignoring the chief justice's recommendation, the government yesterday appointed a judge to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court by superseding three senior judges of the High Court Division.

Justice M Joynul Abedin superseded senior judges Syed Amirul Islam, MD Hassan Ameen and AK Badrul Huq in the appointment signed by President Iajuddin Ahmed after consultation with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia.

Earlier, Justice Syed Amirul Islam was superseded four times.

Judge appointed in Appellate Division Judges' confirmation draws strong protest

Lawyers decry govt decision ignoring CI's recommendations

The 17 newly confirmed judges took oath yesterday amidst protest by a large section of lawyers at the government's ignoring the chief justice's recommended list in confirming services of the judges.

The Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) demonstrated at the Bar building denouncing what they said is confirmation of judges on political consideration.

Renowned legal expert Dr Kamal Hossain said he felt as if a grenade has been thrown on him when he came to know about the SEE PAGE 15 COL 7 ; judges' confirmation. Talking to

the press, he said, "This (confirmation of judges) is an attack on the judiciary and the constitution. This should be resisted.

Former SCBA president Barrister Rokanuddin Mahmud said the government threw away recommendations of the chief justice. This is the saddest event in the history of the Supreme Court,

The government on Tuesday confirmed services of 17 additional judges of the HC, ignoring the chief justice's recommendations. There were 19 additional judges awaiting confirmation. The chief justice recommended confirmation of 15

on the basis of their performance over the last two years. But the government included two more udges -- Emdadul Haq Azad and Faisal Mahmud Faizee-- in the confirmation list

While the chief justice did not recommend these two judges, Faizee had triggered a controversy when he was appointed as an additional judge. The SCBA launched an agitation for his removal questioning the genuineness of his Bachelor of Law (LLB) certificate. But the government ignored its demand. And now the chief justice's recommendations

Israel accused of war crimes in Lebanon

Amnesty charges it for deliberately targeting civilian infrastructure; Lebanon asks US to help end Israel blockade

AGENCIES, Beirut/ London

Israel committed "war crimes" by deliberately targeting Lebanese civilian infrastructure during the recent conflict with the Shiite Hezbollah militia, the Amnesty International said yesterday.

The human rights group claimed that both Hezbollah and, the Jewish state had committed grave violations" of international humanitarian law but said there was an "Israeli policy of deliberate destruction" of non-military tar-

"Israel's assertion that the attacks on the infrastructure were lawful is manifestly wrong," the

London-based group's executive deputy secretary general Kate Gilmore said as she launched their report into the hostilities.

Many of the violations identified in our report are war crimes, including indiscriminate and disproportionate attacks. "The evidence strongly suggests

that the extensive destruction of power and water plants, as well as the transport infrastructure vital for food and other humanitarian relief, was deliberate and an integral part of a military strategy."

The report -- "Deliberate destruction or 'collateral damage'? Israeli attacks against civilian infrastructure" -- is based on

research from Amnesty's own missions in Israel and Lebanon, plus interviews with dozens of

Meanwhile, Lebanon yesterday urged the United States to make Israel remove a sea and air blockade it imposed at the start of its 34day war with Hezbollah fighters.

Prime Minister Fouad Siniora also called on Washington to boost its financial aid to help Lebanor recover from war-related economic damage running into billions of dollars

FDI dipped 15pc last fiscal year for foreign investment but the

Foreign direct investment (FDI) declined by 15.16 percent last fiscal year (FY06) in stark contrast with a 107 percent rise in the previous year, according to Bangladesh Bank (BB) statistics.

Economists mainly blamed the government's negotiation skills with prospective foreign investors and increase in profit repatriation for the situation.

In FY06, \$675 million FDI flowed in against \$800 million in FY05, showing a \$125 million dip, BB statistics shows. In FY05, FDI flow was \$415 million more than the previous fiscal.

"The government failed to negotiate with prospective foreign investors," Dr Zaid Bakht, research director of the Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS), told The Daily Star yesterday.

Dr Bakht referred to the power projects, which had huge scopes

Monday afternoon modernisation of Bangladesh suffered a major setback when Prime Minister Khaleda Zia announced that the highest degree awarded by the orthodox Qawami madrasa would be equated with the master's

The ramifications of her announcement are so far reaching that many think it will forever change the intellectual superstructure of the Bangladesh society. In time, nothing will be the same as before, and everything will change be it economy, politics, culture, society, civil administration and law and order. And all this had been done with one tunnel vision -- to win votes in the upcoming elec-

But Bangladesh's history of this plunge into the abysmal darkness as not been unbroken Bangladesh was a society of cultural and religious harmony with a thriving progressive political front. Born out of a two-nation theory with the Hindus and Muslims living in separate homelands, Pakistan from which Bangladesh broke away in 1971 through a bloody war still offered the Bangalees the resilience to maintain the religious harmony. In fact, to throw off the yoke of the West Pakistani psyche of mixing Islam with everything and to get closer to the people of Bengal, the Awami Muslim League showed in the mid 50s the courage to drop the middle name to become Awami League.
