7 killed, 60 bullet-hit as cops, BDR open fire

Indefinite hartal called

At least seven people were killed and about 300 injured as police and Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) opened fire on demonstrators advancing towards the office of Asia Energy Corporation (Bangladesh) Pvt Ltd in Dinajpur yesterday.

Thousands of demonstrators, mainly farmers and indigenous people including women armed with bows and arrows and sticks, joined the protest apprehending massive eviction and loss of farmland that might be caused by the implementation of the Phulbari Coalmine Project.

Freed in 3 cases, Ershad awaits another verdict today

A Dhaka court is set to deliver the verdict today on the corruption case filed against Jatiya Party Chairman HM Ershad in connection with allotting plots illegally to 49 persons when he was president.

The First Additiona Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, which will deliver the verdict is also scheduled to hold hearing of a gold smuggling case filed agains the deposed president.

The trial of the plot-allotment case began in 1998. The court completed its hearing on August 13 and fixed today for delivering the verdict.

The court framed charges against Ershad and acquitted the then Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) chairman Rahamat Ullah after finding no conclusive evidence against him on March 9, 1992.

Ershad was acquitted in three graft cases last week following his announcement to join the ruling BNP-led alliance ahead of the next SEE PAGE 15 COL 7

Ivory Coast crash kills 6 Bangladeshi peacekeepers

Six UN peacekeepers from Bangladesh were killed and 11 others seriously injured in a road accident in Ivory Coast on Friday hours after they reached the West African state for duty.

A truck carrying the soldiers crashed at Tiasali, some 125km off Ivory Coast capital Yamoussoukro, and veered into a roadside ditch at around 5:30pm local time (11:30pm Bangladesh time), said the director of Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR).

The deceased are lance corporal SM Miraz Ahmed (20 Field

Regiment, Artillery) hailing from village Kanudeshkathi in Rajapur upazila under Jhalakathi district, lance corporal M Abdus Sattar (6 Field Regiment, Artillery) hailing from village Dariapur in Chapainawabganj upazila under the district, soldier Abdul Halim (27 Field Regiment, Artillery) hailing from village Bara Chaisuti in Kuliarchar upazila under Kishoreganj district, soldier Mohammad Kamruzzaman Khan (36 Air Defence, Regiment, Artillery) of village Bamutia in Chandina upazila under Comilla district, soldier Mohammad Shahid Mia (32 Field Regiment,

Kulaura upazila under Moulvibazar district and soldier M Mizanur Rahman (24 Field Regiment, Artillery) of village Bhakutia under Jessore district.

The injured, one in a critical state, are undergoing treatment at a local hospital, said an ISPR press

Hunt for outlaws begins amid high alert

Police in six northern districts were put on the highest level of alert yesterday, and they launched combing operations in the areas identified as 'outlaw prone' by a closed door meeting of the law enforcers in Chowbaria chaired by the inspector general of police.

The alert was issued after receiving information that the outlaws of self-styled Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) are active again in the region and they might embark on more severe attacks, meeting sources said. The identified six trouble prone

districts are -- Rajshahi, Naogaon, Chapainawabganj, Bogra, Pabna and Sirajganj. An intensified drive was launched against the outlaws

The PBCP outlaws killed four

policemen and a BNP leader, and looted a pistol, a shot gun, a Chinese rifle and a .303 rifle from the policemen at Chowbaria market under Manda upazila in Naogaon on Friday. Meanwhile, a PBCP (Lal Potaka)

source told The Daily Star that PBCP claims responsibility for the murders. Inspector General of Police (IGP) Anwarul Iqbal who rushed to Chowbaria from the capital follow-
