Iran defies UN, opens nuclear reactor

US may freeze Iranian assets and restrict trade, reports LA Times

An Iranian plant that produces heavy water officially went into operation vesterday, despite UN demands that Tehran stop the activity because it can be used to develop a nuclear bomb.

President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad inaugurated the plant, which Tehran says is for peaceful purposes

The announcement comes days before Thursday's UN deadline for Iran to stop uranium enrichment which also can be used to create ing cancer. nuclear weapons or face economic

The plant's top official, Manouchehr Madadi, said the facility has the ability to produce up to 16 tons of heavy water a year.

Hartal observed in Jessore to protest attack on AL leader


