Feeder operators cease agitation in Ctg Port

Chittagong Feeder Trade Committee (CFTC) withdrew its agitation programme of suspending loading and unloading of con-tainers at Chittagong Port yester-day with immediate effect.

The suspension programme was withdrawn following a four-hour long discussion with State Minister for Shipping Mohammad Quamrul Islam at his office last night.

The Singapore-based feeder ve sel operators also agreed to refund the congestion surcharges realised since August 20.

Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) also agreed to withdraw the cases it filed against the five feeder vessel operators.
The CFTC stopped loading and

unloading containers at Chittagong Port following a contempt case filed by the BGMEA for realising congestion surcharge from June 5.

Investigators to bring 4 arrestees face to face with Mufti Hannan

Investigators may bring Harkatul lihad al Islami (HuJi) leader Mufti Abdul Hannan face to face with four arrestees to cross-examine their statements regarding the grenade attack on British High Commissioner Anwar Choudhury.

A taskforce of combined intelligence officials is interrogating the four, who were arrested from Sylhet division on Saturday and Sunday, to extract detailed information about their involvement in the attack and the masterminds behind them.

HuJi leader Abdur Rouf, who was arrested along with 26 others in Bhaluka in Mymensingh on August 2, may also be brought before them SEE PAGE 15 COL 8

NUF presents huge pens to CEC to resign

The newly formed National Unity Front (NUF) in an unprecedented move tried to give chief election commissioner (CEC) and three other election commissioners four eight-foot-long pens, symbolically asking them to resign from their posts within seven days.

NUF leaders Major (retd) Abdul Mannan, Mahi B Chowdhury MP, Abdur Rouf and Zakir Hossain carried the pens, which had slogans demanding their resignation printed on them, to the Election Commission (EC).

They left the pens next to the

CEC's nameplate in front of his office on the first floor of the EC building at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar as the CEC and the election commissioners did not receive the pens.

"We requested them to resign before but they did not respond. So we tried to give them symbolic SEE PAGE 15 COL 3

EC now passing buck on court for delay

In defence of seeking exemption from Public Procurement Regulation (PPR) 2003 for printing updated electoral rolls, the Election Commission (EC) is now passing on the blame for delay in preparing the list on the shoulders of the Supreme Court.

The Cabinet Purchase Committee however declined to provide the EC with the exemption as indiscriminately as it is seeking,

ing that it is seeking the exemption to enable itself to finish printing the updated voter list before the election scheduled for next January, sources said.

With the parliamentary election around the corner, the EC has yet to complete the preparation of the voter list and it will take at least two months to finish the task even if it is exempted from the regulation. The EC Secretariat has yet to even start the process of printing the updated

The EC, which had wasted at least six months by dilly-dallying to implement the court's orders for updating the existing voter list, requested the Cabinet Purchase Committee on August 22 to exempt it from PPR to complete printing the voter list on time.

In a summary, approved by the EC and sent by its secretariat to the Cabinet Purchase Committee, the commission said activities for
