Tax holiday to continue

NBR chief says after meeting with IMF team

UNB, Dhaka

National Board of Revenue (NBR) Chairman M Abdul Karim has said tax exemptions and tax holiday will continue although International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank are repeatedly pressing for the

"We will do it by ourselves when we think the time has come for such withdrawal," he said after a meeting with a visiting IMF delegation at his office yesterday. IMF Advisor for Asia Pacific Department Thomas Rumbaugh led the delegation.

The NBR chairman said tax exemptions and tax holiday are offered for the national interest and welfare of the local industries.

He indicated that the government would withdraw tax exemptions and tax holiday gradually when "we will find a particular sector has become self-reliant.

Unidentified assailants gunned down a ward unit leader of Swechchhasebak League at East Badda in the capital yesterday.

Yusuf Khan, 25, was the president of Badda ward No 3 unit of Swechchhasebak League

Locals said a gang of three to four youths came and one of them shot Yusuf in the chest once while he was talking with two other people some 20 yards off his sister's house at Post Office Goli at around 10:20am.

"Bullet-hit, Yusuf ran to our sister's house where he collapsed," said the victim's elder brother MA Gani. Relatives and locals rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) immediately, but he died on the way, he added.

US hands over army control to Iraq

39 killed in attacks, 27 convicted 'terrorists' hanged

Insurgents killed at least 39 Iraqis on Thursday as a wave of car bombings in the capital marked the day when the embattled Baghdad government began to take command of its own armed forces.

Meanwhile, as lawmakers debated a controversial law which could see the country divided into rival regions, gunmen kidnapped a nephew of parliament's hardline Sunni Arab speaker, who opposes the break-up.

Two more American soldiers also died, the US military said, bringing the week's coalition fatalities to 17.

The latest violence came as Iraqi Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki signed an accord with US com-

mander General George Casey to begin taking back control of Iraq's armed forces, which had hitherto come under US command.

The handover gave Maliki operational control of Iraq's fledgling air force and navy, and began the process of putting the army's 10 divisions under a newly-created joint headquarters, independent of US control.

"It's a great step and a great day in Iraqi history," Maliki said.

"The new Iraqi army is being built by the courage of its sons, who will dedicate their lives to protect their citizenry, and today the new Iragi army has been rebuilt on values other than sectarianism." he

Nevertheless. Thursday's signing ceremony only marked the

beginning of the handover process. The 8th Iraqi Army Division, stationed in Najaf, will come under Iraqi command, with two more divisions added every month after-

"From today Iraqi military operations will be increasingly conceived and led by Iraqi forces. It marks a milestone in the relentless journey of Iraqi forces, a study in courage perseverance and the values of Irag." Casev said

He added, however, that America's troops would not head home soon.

"We will continue to fight with you to protect the Iraqi people, wherever they are threatened," he said. "We still have a long way to

Govt given Sept 18 deadline for reforms

Opposition threatens topple-govt agitation

The city unit of the Awami Leagueled 14-party opposition combine at a rally yesterday demanded that the alliance government accept the proposed electoral reforms by September 18, and warned of a one-point agitation to topple the government if it fails to do so.

The rally was held to mark the 'day against torture', and protest police atrocities on opposition leaders and workers during the Election Commission (EC) Secretariat siege programme on Wednesday, leaving around 100 leaders and workers including AL

chief Sheikh Hasina's Political Secretary Saber Hossain Chowdhury injured.

Meanwhile, Hasina sat last night with senior party leaders to discuss the final round of anti-government Asked prior to the meeting if it

would decide on one-point agitation to dislodge the government, AL Presidium Member Kazi Zafarullah said they would discuss the overall political situation in the country.

Israel starts to lift Lebanon blockade

Israel said it started to lift its eightweek air and sea blockade of Lebanon at 1500 GMT yesterday, three weeks after a ceasefire brought an end to its offensive against Hezbollah.

"It's now six o'clock, the blockade is being lifted," foreign ministry spokesman Marc Regev told AFP.

A spokeswoman for Prime Minister Ehud Olmert's office, Miri Eisin, said that the lifting would involve a "gradual handing over of control of Lebanese maritime territory" to UN forces.

Israel had begun to coordinate with UN troops in Lebanon on the lifting of the restrictions 24 hours earlier, she said

Israel was ending its punishing

eight-week blockade of Lebanon amid intense international efforts to ensure a ceasefire holds between Israel and the Shia Muslim militant group Hezbollah.

Israel announced it had begun to lift its air and sea blockade at 1500 GMT after receiving assurances that international peacekeeping forces stationed in Lebanon would enforce an arms embargo against the Syrian-backed Hezbollah.

However it said it reserved the right to attack suspected Hezbollah arms convoys on the Lebanon-Syria
