15 killed, 81 injured in road accidents

At least 15 people were killed and 81 injured in separate road accidents in Faridpur, Mymensingh, Netrakona, Manikganj, Munshiganj, Khulna and

Chittagong on Friday and Saturday. Our Correspondent from Faridpur reports: At least 5 people were killed and 29 seriously injured in a road accident at Maniknagar under Nagarkanda Police Station on Friday.

The accident occurred when driver of a Faridpur-bound passenger bus from Natore loast control over its steering on Maniknagar Bridge and fell into a nearby ditch. The bus was going to Atrashi.

Two people died on the spot while three others succumbed to their injuries in Faridpur Medical College Hospital. Of the injured, condition of five are critical.

The dead were identified as Razzak, 45, Sajul, 30, Hajrat, 60, Monirul, 30 and Nazrul, 55. A case was lodged with

Our Correspondent from Mymensingh says: At least three people, including a woman, were killed and 30 others injured in a road accident at Bailor in Trishal on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway on Friday.

MINIMUM WAGES RMG workers demand implementation of agreement
