Ex-Jubo League leader killed in 'crossfire'

A former Jubo League leader was killed in "crossfire" during a shootout between the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) and his cohorts at Adabor in

the city yesterday.

Acting on a tip-off, Rab raided a Dhaka-bound bus near Kaliakoir that was coming from Sirajganj on Saturday afternoon and picked up Dulal, Rab sources said. The bus was also seized

The Rab took him to Nabodoy Housing Balu Math in the early hours yesterday to recover illegal arms from his den and to nab his accomplices, the Rab sources

When the Rab personnel neared their den. Dulal's accomplices opened fire on them, forcing the law enforcers to retaliate.

Dulal fell in the line of fire and died on the spot, the sources added. A revolver was recovered from

Police sources said that Dulal was accused in at least six cases. including two for murder.

His family sources, however, said that all the cases against him were political, adding that he was released on bail three months back. He was a former president of ward no 43 Jubo League, they further said

Thunderbolt kills two

identified as Nurul Islam. Local people said at the time of the incident five farmers were working in a paddy filed. Three of them survived taking quick shelter in shallow pump house.

Fight against terrorism not against Islam

Says US envoy

US Ambassador in Dhaka Patricia A Butenis has lauded the people of Bangladesh for rejecting the extremists' terrorism and their conception of society saying, "They (Bangladeshis) chose freedom over tyranny and tolerance over intolerance.

The fight against terrorism is not a war against Islam, this is a struggle that unites the peoples of the USA, the UK, Bangladesh and India, said the ambassador yesterday in a statement in memory of September 11 terrorist attacks in

"The anniversary of September 11 terrorist attacks is an appropriate occasion for the international community to reaffirm our unequivocal condemnation of all acts of terror. No faith condones the deliberate targeting and killing of innocent civilians, and no cause or grievance - no matter how legitimate - can ever justify it," she said.

Butenis said the victims of September 11 were citizens of more than 90 different countries including Bangladesh and adherents of many faiths including

Since Osama bin Laden declared war on America ten vears ago, thousands of people of many nations, religions, races and beliefs have been murdered as a result of his instigation or incitement of acts of terror, she added.

"Terrorist attacks against the United States and our friends and allies began long before we acted to remove the Taliban regime which was harbouring al Qaeda in Afghanistan," she said.

Butenis said al Qaeda's agenda is to impose a Taliban-like tyrannical regime on many proud and sovereign nations of the Islamic world, "and they have nothing but intolerance for all those who do not share their extremist beliefs including fellow Muslims.

"Whether or not they had direct ties to al Qaeda, this is also the type of society that violent extremists sought for Bangladesh. The people of Bangladesh rejected the extremists' terrorism and their conception of society; they chose freedom over tyranny and tolerance over intolerance," the US Ambassador said.

She said despite al-Qaeda's repeated attempts to characterize the world as being in the midst of a clash of civilisations, the simple fact is that the international community comes together to confront common threats and ease human

The US envoy said, "Here in Bangladesh we provide funds for Muslim girls and boys to go to school, for Muslim women to visit health clinics, and for Muslim young people to get training for jobs not because they are Muslim, but because of our shared human-

"As we look back on September 11, 2001 we also look forward. We seek to work in a spirit of partnership with people and nations across the world to confront this ideology of hate and foster a climate of hope and opportunity. We are far from perfect, yet we believe the ideals of freedom and justice that guide us are universal," said




