SL cricketers get pay hike

Sri Lanka's domestic cricketers will get a handsome raise in match fees for the coming season in a bid to make local competition more professional, a top official announced here on Sunday.

"We have a 300 percent pay hike earmarked for players in a new domestic competition for the 2006-07 season," K. Mathivanan, secretary of the Sri Lanka Cricket interim committee, told AFP.

He said each player competing in the new super premier league threeday matches would be paid 3,000 rupees (30 US dollars) per day.

"Each player will end up receiving around 1,400 dollars per season, up from around 400 to 500 dollars now," Mathivanan said.

He said the aim was to make first-class tournaments more competitive and professional so as to help domestic players prepare for international matches.

Shane Warne- beyond the cricketer

He is Australia's most controversial sportsman but he's also a marketer's dream; he appears to be doing nothing wrong both on and off the field. In November 2005, the living legend Shane Warne was signed as the name behind the company, 'Messages on Hold'. Greg Chapell, former Australian cricket captain and current Indian coach and legend stating "Warne has been implicated in this scandal with no basis of proof and its quite obvious that the RBA are using Warne as a scapegoat at the moment as any allegation made against him would generally be accepted by the public as ... and I'm being fair to Shane here, the man has the social graces of a haemorrhoid."

mally overpowering serve. Despite leading the tournament with aces, Roddick totalled just seven on Sunday, well below his average. He did not strike his second ace until the final game of the second set.

Roddick gets full marks for from just over the service line.
