League of champions returns

Barcelona last season ended a 14-year wait to be recrowned kings

of Europe after dominating Arsenal in a pulsating final in Paris. And Frank Rijkaard's Samuel

Eto'o and Ronaldinho-inspired side begin this season's campaign in group A with what should be a manageable encounter at the Nou Camp against Levski Sofia.

On the first night of Champions League group action this season, no less than five former European champions are in action -- and all. including Barcelona, will be desperate to get their respective campaigns off on the right foot.

Former titleholders Bayern Munich are at home to Spartak

Moscow, PSV Eindhoven host fellow former champions Liverpool and Inter Milan take their European pedigree to Sporting Lisbon.

However a night of European action would not be complete without those who have yet to get their hands on football's most coveted club trophy -- and Chelsea are leading the early claimants.

Ruud delight for Real

Real Madrid's Ruud van Nistelroov and David Beckham rediscovered the understanding they once had at Manchester United as the Spanish giants

comfortably won 4-1 at newlypromoted Levante on Sunday. The pair showed that they still

have more in common than a mutual dislike of Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson with van Nistelrooy scoring a hattrick and Beckham making two of Real's goals.

Van Nistelrooy got his first official goal in a Real jersey from the edge of the area after 16 minutes, his mistimed right foot shot bobbling through the Levante defence Real's second strike on 27 minutes was equally fortuitous with

Beckham's excellent long-range pass being bagged by Antonio Cassano. However, not only did the ball look as though it had hit the Italian's hand, Cassano's shot was also fumbled by Levante's diving goal-

going in the net. Life got worse for the hosts, with

keeper Pablo Cavallero before

former Real Madrid coach Juan Ramon Lopez Caro at the helm, two minutes later when former French international Frederic Dehu was dismissed after hacking down van Nistelrooy.

Against the odds, Felix Ettien reduced the deficit just before halftime and Real Madrid coach Fabio Capello, unhappy with the direction the game had taken in the last 10 minutes of the first half, rung the changes during half time.

Capello pulled off Cassano and club captain Raul Gonzalez at half time and sent on Jose Antonio Reyes for his Real debut and the speedy Brazilian international

Van Nistelrooy and Beckham then combined for Real's third goal, arquably the best of the night, 12 minutes after the break.

"Things were going well up to the point where we scored three goals, we were playing well, but after that we stopped," reflected Real coach Fabio Capello after the match.

Perhaps Capello was thinking of the penalty van Nistelrooy five minutes from the whistle, for which Levante midfielder Diego Camacho also got his marching orders for bringing van Nistelrooy down in the area

Nevertheless, the Dutch striker completed his hattrick in injury time, chipping over the head of Cavallero from a Cicinho pass.

Sevilla retained their place at the top of the Spanish first division

with a 3-1 win at Real Sociedad. "The fact that we are at the top is no coincidence. We are winning. we have scored plenty of goals and as long as we can stay at the top the fans will be allowed to dream a little," said the delighted Sevilla coach Juande Ramos.

Last season's UEFA Cup winners went ahead after just eight minutes with Brazilian striker Renato finishing off a counterattack by the visitors to the Basque country

Frederic Kanoute added a second for Sevilla, the third consecutive game in which he has scored, 15 minutes before the end, before both teams got a goal apiece in injury time.

It was a good night for clubs from Seville against Basque teams on Sunday.

Real Betis won 3-0 at home to Athletic Bilbao, going in at half time well in the driving seat thanks to two first half two goals from close range by Juanito Gutierrez and Edu before 'Capi' Capitan put the game beyond any doubt with Betis' third seven minutes from time.

Getafe also retained their unbeaten record with a 1-0 win over Racing Santander, with Daniel Guiza getting the only goal of a scrappy game just before the hour to put the Madrid side up to third.

European champions Bavern Munich have admitted they no longer consider themselves as automatic contenders for the Champions League.

Four-time

Germany's league and cup holders Bayern host Spartak Moscow in their first Champions League group match on Tuesday with manager Felix Magath saying qualification from the group stage is this season's target.

"We need to get past the group stage and that is what can be expected of us. After that a lot depends on the draw," Magath said in an interview with Kicker maga-

"The main target is to still be in the competition in 2007."

Since winning the competition in 2001 - when they defeated Valencia on penalties - Bayern have failed to go further than the quarterfinals and last season they were crushed 5-2 on aggregate by AC Milan at the last 16 stage.

German international captain Michael Ballack left for Chelsea in the summer and Magath admits his team is not as strong as he hoped.

"We have swapped experienced pros for younger players and at the moment we are not better equipped than in previous years," Magath acknowledged.

"But we will improve as a team. The likes of (Owen) Hargreaves, (Bastian) Schweinsteiger and (Philipp) Lahm must now take on more responsibility."

Club president Franz Beckenbauer, a World Cup winner with West Germany in 1974, agrees that Bayern are no longer part of Europe's elite but should still be beating teams such as Russia's Snartak

"This year we are not among the favourites who have aspirations to win the Champions League but if we want to progress we have to beat teams like this," said Beckenbauer.

Aragones resignation rejected

The Spanish Football Federation (RFEF) on Monday said it had rejected an offer by national team coach Luis Aragones to resign.

Aragones has been under fire after a humiliating 3-2 defeat by Northern Ireland last week in a Euro 2008 qualifier.

An RFEF spokesman told AFP on Monday that Aragones "met the Federation president this morning and indicated to him he wanted to

The spokesman said the RFEF had reiterated that the veteran coach still enjoyed "the full confidence" of the organisation, adding that Aragones was going to spend "a couple of days" thinking things

Aragones, 67, took over after a poor Spanish showing at Euro 2004 under predecessor Inaki Saez. Despite saying he wanted to


