Viduka to reioin Socceroos

Socceroos captain Mark Viduka indicated Tuesday he would return to the Australian national team for next year's Asian Cup.

Viduka considered giving up international football after leading Australia into the last 16 of the World Cup in Germany to concentrate on his club career, he told the official website of Middlesbrough Football

"A lot of us were thinking when we got to those sorts of highs, is it going to get any better than this?,"

However he has changed his mind and now plans to rejoin the Socceroos, the website said

"It's a big commitment playing for Australia because there's such a lot of travelling and it means being away from the family and not being able to concentrate fully on playing for your club," the 30-year-old said.

The Middlesbrough striker missed the recent Asian Cup qualifier against Kuwait -- which Australia lost 2-0 -- to be with his pregnant "I've come to an agreement with

(Australia's interim coach) Graham (Arnold) because my wife is pregnant ... so I want to be with her at this time," he said. With his wife due to give birth in

October, Viduka is unlikely to play in the Socceroos' final Asian Cup qualifier against Bahrain around the same time, he said.

"I don't know if I will play in the next game ... we've already qualified anyway," he said

Bus driver strands rowdy fans

A bus driver dumped his load of celebrating Marseille fans around 300km from home after becoming fed up with their rowdy antics.

The fans were celebrating their team's 3-1 win over bitter rivals Paris St Germain on Sunday as they made their way home

But their bus driver could not tolerate the behaviour of the 50 fans and dumped them at a train station at Villefranche-sur-Saone, near Lyon and around 300km from Marseille.

It was the second stop for the fans who faced a nightmare home-

ward journey that took almost a day. They had not left the capital until around 1am but their first bus was involved in a minor accident on the A6 motorway at Macon, 60km north of Lyon, and the Marseille fans had to wait by the side of the road for several hours before another bus. hired by Marseille, arrived to take

But now it was the middle of the day following the evening match but the second part of the journey did not last long before the second bus driver ordered the fans off his vehi-

Faced with some anary football supporters, a dozen police arrived at the Villefranche-sur-Saone train station to keep a close watch over proceedings before a third bus, with a third different driver, arrived to take the fans home.

They arrived almost a full 24 hours after the match between PSG and Marseille had been played.

It is not clear whether or not the second driver was a PSG fan.

Heinz signs for St Etienne



Arsenal aim to finally get their season up and running on Wednesday when they travel

to Germany to face SV Hamburg in the first Champions League Group G match.

Last season's runners-up Arsenal, who lost 2-1 to Barcelona in the Paris final, have had a wretched start to the 2006/07 season and lie fourth from bottom of the Premiership table after failing to win any of their first three

On Sunday Arsenal face a mammoth duel against league leaders Manchester United but manager Arsene Wenger wants to concentrate on the task in hand.

"Let's focus on Europe. If we get a good result in Hamburg we'll go in good condition to Man Utd," Wenger

"I can't say that I am unconcerned by our start to the season. We are lacking a bit of sharpness because half the team has been away for the whole summer playing football.'

Forward Thierry Henry has looked far from his best - after a gruelling summer in which he played the entire World Cup with finalists France - and Wenger will hope his star striker turns on the style

Henry has 49 goals in Europe (including 41 in the Champions League) to his name and will hope to bring up the half century landmark against Hamburg.

German international goalkeeper Jens Lehmann also has a personal goal in mind as he bids to extend his record run without conceding a goal in the competition.

Arsenal conceded twice in the final defeat to Barcelona but Lehmann was sent off after 18 minutes with the score at 0-0 and his record stands at

12 hours and 43 minutes.

Wenger has been forced to reshuffle the defence for the Hamburg clash with French international William Gallas set to be shoehorned in at left back - ironically the position he detested at Chelsea - as Gael Clichvis injured.

Inexperienced Swiss defender Johan Djorou is set to partner Kolo Toure in central defence

Hamburg have problems of their own with Dutch international playmaker Rafael van der Vaart, Argentina captain Juan Pablo Sorin and Cameroon defender Thimothee Atouba all sidelined.



Spain coach Luis Aragones has said he changed his mind about quitting because the Spanish Federation (RFEF) and his coaching assistants convinced him he had no reason to throw in the towel.

The 68-year-old offered his resignation after the Spanish media called for his head following Spain's 3-2 defeat by Northern Ireland in a Euro 2008 qualifier last Wednesday.

'I originally thought that I should

resign because of the bad result, but they (the RFEF) wouldn't accept my decision,' Aragones told Spanish television station Telecinco on Monday evening

met with my assistants they persuaded me to change my mind. 'I decided that I should continue because they all said we weren't in a desperate situation and that we could

The tournament is now called the FIFA Club World Championship and features the champions of every continent, with Brazil's Sao Paulo the current holders. Whatever the format.

Mourinho admits competing for a world title is a driving force behind his desire to win the Champions League for a second

He said: "I made one mistake in Porto. I left there when I was European champion.
