Sust teachers stage sit-in

The opposition backed teachers of the Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) staged sit-in in front of the Registrar building on the campus yesterday to press their demand for immediate withdrawal of the vice-chancellor to restore 'congenial atmosphere' in the university.

The teachers at a rally called upon the authorities concerned to withdraw the 'corrupt and inefficient' VC and appoint a new one.

Former Sust Teachers Association president Dr Akhtarul Islam presided over the meeting.

Meanwhile, the female students staged sit-in in front of the main gate of the university for about two hours from 10:00am demanding an immediate end to the stalemate.
