## 15 injured as Ctg Polytech JCD factions clash

At least 15 activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) of Chittagong Polytechnic Institute unit were injured in a factional clash near the institute campus yesterday.

Of the injured, seven were identified as Jamir Uddin Nahid, Kamrul

Islam Khokan, Fakhrul, Shafiullah Razu, Julfiker Ali, Mohammed Masud and Tareq.

The agitating students also vandalised eight shops during the clash.

According to sources, the clash ensued at around 10:00am when a group of JCD activists led by Tinku

Das reportedly assaulted one Fakhrul of another group led by Ahmedul Alam Chowdhury Russell over establishing supremacy in the institute area.

Both the groups attacked each other with hockey sticks and iron rods during the clash.

## CUFL employees suspend supply of fertiliser from today

Chittagong Urea Fertiliser Limited (CUFL) Sramik Karmachari Union leaders yesterday declared that they would suspend sale and supply of fertiliser to the dealers for three days from today to press home their nine-point demand.

The declaration came from a demonstration staged by the union held at the CUFL main gate at 10:00am yesterday with its President SultanulAzim in the chair.

Union General Secretary Harun Ur Rashid, Senior Vice President Md Bazlur Rahman Bhuiyan, Vice President Md Shamsuddin, Joint Secretary Sheikh Mohammad Selim and Organising Secretary Md Jamal Hossain spoke at the rally.

The nine-point demand includes immediate implementation of the revised national wage commission, enlistment of all the workers under wage commission, providing subsidy to the fertiliser industries and others.

Harun Ur Rashid said that it was the part of the central programme declared by Bangladesh Chemical Workers' Federation (BCWF) and would be observed in all the industries under Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC).
