Barcelona march on

Spanish league rivals David Beckham and Samuel Eto'o were among the players making the headlines on Sunday -- but for distinctly opposite reasons.

Beckham, still hurting from recently learning that he is for the moment no longer part of the England team, scored Real Madrid's second goal in a 2-0 win over Real Sociedad at the Santiago Bernabeu.

Former Arsenal forward Jose Antonio Reves opened the scoring for Real in the 69th minute, and Beckham's 90th minute goal sealed the points which kept Fabio Capello's under-fire side within touching distance of their arch rivals.

Barcelona are not top of the Spanish league, but after their 3-0 away humbling of Racing Santander they are only behind onform Sevilla on goals difference.

Racing got off to a lively start. and were unlucky not to have taken a two-goal lead inside the first 20 minutes.

However Barcelona, the reigning European and Spanish champions. showed their class soon afterwards when Eto'o broke the deadlock with a superb strike from long range. The Cameroonian international's

swerving shot from 25 yards bounced just before it reached Racing's keeper, and slipped almost inexplicably past his grasp and into the net.

Barcelona were forced into a nervous wait throughout the second half before Frenchman Ludovic Giuly doubled their lead in the 84th

That gave Barca the freedom to roam, and Brazilian showman Ronaldinho added their third goal

from the penalty spot. Sevilla top the table thanks mainly to the goalscoring efforts of former West Ham and Tottenham striker Frederic Kanoute, who grabbed a goal in each half before Brazilian Renato Dirnei scored an

Beckham admits England fear

Former England captain David Beckham said Monday there was a possibility he may never play for his country again. The high-profile Real Madrid

midfielder, who had a poor World Cup earlier this summer and then decided to give up the captain's armband, added he would be trying to get back into the reckoning Beckham, 31, who was left out of

the first England squad selected by Steve McClaren, told BBC radio: "When I've had knocks before I've always wanted to prove people wrong, and I want to do that again.

"If I never play for England again then I've played 94 times and captained England for six years and have had an amazing time playing for England. I don't want it to end, I want it to carry on. If I was a betting man I wouldn't bet on me playing again -- but who knows?"

Despite not being part of the McClaren era. Beckham insists there are grounds for optimism

under the new regime Speaking to BBC Radio One, the Real Madrid midfielder said: "The whole change -- the new manager and set-up -- the lads have adapted well and they've got a great captain in John Terry. I've got so much respect for him, he's a young lad but he's captained Chelsea and now England.

There are so many other great players in the team, so I think the future is good."

McClaren, who coached Beckham at Manchester United before the midfielder moved to Real Madrid, told Beckham he was a 'casualty' of the changes being implemented following Sven-Goran Eriksson's reign

Beckham described the day he left out of the squad: "It was out of the blue, I had a few phone calls before from him

asking about my fitness, I thought everything was good.

"He came on the phone and said you've had an amazing time as an England player and captain, I want to move forward'. He said there will be casualties on the way and that 'you are one of the casualties'. It surprised me and I'm gutted.

"At the end of the day he has a

decision to make, when I got off the phone I was angry and disappointed

but I want to play again. Beckham added: "You need things like that to spur you on and prove people wrong. He (McClaren) came to United in 1999, we won the treble that year, he's a good coach and I've sure he'll be a good coach

Ronaldo fine with bench role

Ronaldo said on Sunday that he would be happy to sit on the bench if he is recalled by Brazil and hit back at criticism of his performances at the World Cup.

The Real Madrid striker, who kept his place in the team at the World Cup despite widespread calls for him to be dropped, added that he had always been picked on merit, not on his name.

"My future in the team will always depend on the coach," he said in an interview with Globo television. "If I deserve to be there. I'm sure.

he will pick me and I will play with pride and pleasure.

"I never wanted a guaranteed place in the team, I always wanted to win my place. If I won my place at someone else's expense, it was because I played better and scored more goals, not because I did something underhand."

Asked if he would accept a place on the subsitutes' bench, Ronaldo said: "Yes, I would accept it, certainly. Nobody has, nor has ever had, a guaranteed place.

"All the great players have sat on the bench and this doesn't diminish anvone.

Ronaldo, who will be 30 this month, underwent a minor operation to clean up his left knee after the World Cup and has yet to play SEE PAGE 18 COL 4

Adebayor sinks United

Togo striker Emmanuel Adebayor's late BARCIAYS & goal climits first Arsenal's first Premiership victory this season as

they stunned Manchester United at Old Trafford on Sunday. Adebayor scored in the 85th minute to cap a fine display from

Arsene Wenger's side, who had also missed a glorious chance to take the lead in the first half when Tomasz Kuszczak saved Gilberto Silva's penalty. United had started the season

with four successive league wins but Sir Alex Ferguson's team were below their best as that 100 percent record was ended in dramatic fashion. Spanish midfielder Cesc

Fabregas stole the ball off Cristiano Ronaldo in midfield with five minutes remaining and slipped a perfectly-weighted pass to Adebayor, who flicked his shot past Kuszczak to give Arsenal a first win at Old Trafford since 2002.

The victory was even more impressive as Arsenal, who had drawn two and lost one of their first three league matches, were with-

Defeat for United means they stay second, one point behind surprise leaders Portsmouth

Kuszczak, making his United debut in place of the ill Edwin van der Sar, had conceded a penalty when Adebayor fell as he tried to dribble round the Polish goalkeeper. But Kuszczak redeemed himself as he dived to his right to

keep out Gilberto's spot-kick. Arsenal goalkeeper Jens Lehmann had produced a brave stop to deny Ronaldo in the first half and he ensured the Gunners held on after Adebayor's goal when he turned away Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's late effort.

Didier Drogba's stunning strike moved Chelsea into third place as his side beat Liverpool 1-0 despite Michael Ballack's sending-off.

Elsewhere. South Africa striker Benni McCarthy scored his third goal for Blackburn as his side

Emmanuel Adebayor's goal five minutes from time earned Arsenal a thoroughly deserved 1-0 victory at Old Trafford on Sunday and left United manager Sir Alex Ferguson embarrassed. Ferguson had suggested in his

programme notes that Arsenal were going through a transitional period, yet it was United who looked like the team in the middle of a rebuilding exercise. Wenger insisted the result would kick-start his team's campaign after

a disappointing start by last season's Champions League finalists. "I don't feel we are in transition at all," said Wenger after his side's

first league victory of the season. "It is true that we are a young side, but we are Arsenal and we are

"Nearly everyone has written us off after the start we have made. If you open the newspapers we will

be playing in the Championship next season.

"But I hope that this result sends out the right message. We do want to win the title. Brazil midfielder Gilberto Silva

could even afford the luxury of missing a first-half penalty, after debutant goalkeeper Tomasz Kuszczak had sent Adebayor sprawling, before Togo striker Adebayor capped an impressive performance by firing home the winner to stun a capacity 75,000 crowd.

Wenger added: "You can see we are a strong side from today's performance. I believe in this side.

"We controlled the game and we were always more dangerous than them. We could have been in front with the penalty. "To miss a penalty in a match of

this size and still come back and win shows the character we have in the

"This team has big potential and we showed great spirit.

Wenger picked out Spanish international Cesc Fabregas, who set up the goal, and Adebayor for praise as Arsenal killed off a United side which had won its first four Premiership games of the season.

He said: "Fabregas was abso

lutely outstanding. He didn't stop, but I feel every player did well.

There were a lot of questions asked about us, but the way we came here and won shows the mental strength of the team.

"We didn't get what we deserved from the first three games. "I feel Adebayor has the charac-

teristics to play up front and he brought to the team exactly what we needed.' Ferguson refused to blame Cristiano Ronaldo for the defeat.

The Portuguese winger, who was making his 100th Premiership appearance, was guilty of losing possession to Fabregas in the build up to the goal.

The United manager said: "We looked tired in the second half and Arsenal deserved their victory. "Arsenal were much stronger in

the last 25 minutes. We lost momentum when we stopped passing the ball forward. "It was a bad performance and we can do better. Ronaldo lost

possession because he is the type of player who likes to take other players on. It could have been
