Jalil demands trial of cops for attacking party men

Procession of Swechchhasebak League clubbed again

Police yesterday again launched an unprovoked attack on a procession of Awami Swechchhasebak League in the city yesterday.

The procession was brought out after a rally at Bangabandhu Avenue to protest police excess that left injured at least 20 leaders and workers of the league during countrywide hartal on Thursday.

Police charged baton when the procession reached near Noor Hossain Square leaving at least nine leaders and workers injured.

They are Manju Naznin, Probal Roy, Mir Mehedi Hasan Titu, Mofizul Islam, Qamrul Hasan Ripon, Alamgir Hossain, Golam Rabbani, Zakir Hossain and Imran Hossain

Earlier addressing the rally,

Awami League (AL) General Secretary Abdul Jalil warned that those police personnel, who launched the attack on Awami Swechchhasebak League leaders, would be brought to trial.

The People's Court will be held on Shaheed Minar premises for three hours from 3:00am everyday from October 6 to October 8.
