The richest sports body in the country expected revenue to be on the rise over the next fiscal years. It was observed that the increase in local and ICC revenue has caused the upturn in the surplus, which significantly increased than it was expected.

Mahabub also announced a revenue budget of Taka 47.18 crores against an inflated expenditure budget of Taka 67.41 crores for the 2006-07 Annual Global Budget. There is an existing reserve of 40 crores, half of which is expected to be spent over the fiscal period.

"We actually term the budget as conservative as we have taken only the minimum amount in every factor," said the BCB general secretary. One of the encouraging signs of the

budget is the provision given for player bonus which is based on winning performances. Last year, it was Taka one crore, but now the allotment has been heavily increased to Taka four

crores The much-talked about television rights revenue has brought the board four million dollars, much of which came from India's tour to Bangladesh in December 2004. The board expects the same when India is here to play next year.

There were administrative changes as well. Except the grounds, tournament and Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolis (CCDM), all the other committee must now have a minimum of eleven members.

The women's wing, as advised by the ICC, has also been approved during the meeting as Bangladesh was the only nation not to have such a committee for women.

The governing body of cricket maintained its standard in all aspects, especially the financial side as the budget that has been proposed is bigger than any other sporting body. Clearly, the Asghar-led board has left the board in a much healthier financial and infrastructural base than ever before.

Record prize money for **Aussie Open**

A record prize money pool of 20 million dollars (15 million US) will be on offer for next year's Australian Open, Tennis Australia said here Tuesday.

The winners of the men's and women's singles will collect 1.28 million dollars (960,000 US) each, the organisers said.

The first tennis Grand Slam of 2007, which takes place from January 15-28 at Melbourne Park, is expected to attract more than 500 of the world's top players.

The last Australian Open drew a record 550,550 fans -- the seventh successive year it broke the halfmillion spectators' mark, Tournament Director Craig Tiley said at the event's launch Tuesday.

Russia's Davis Cup hero Dmitry Tursunov completed a remarkable fortnight by winning his maiden ATP title at the inaugural Mumbai Open here on Monday.

Tursunov, ranked 22 in the world outlasted world number 13 Tomas Berdych of the Czech Republic 6-3, 4-6, 7-6 in a rain-hit final at the Cricket Club of India courts here. Last week, the 23-year-old had

led Russia to a brilliant Davis Cup win over the United States in Moscow by beating the fancied Andy Roddick 17-15 in the fifth set of the deciding fourth rubber. The Mumbai final, that was put

off on Sunday due to heavy rain, was twice interrupted by rain, the first time at 1-1 in the second set and then again at 5-5 in the third set. When play resumed the second

time, Tursunov broke Berdych to lead 6-5 but the third-seeded Czech broke back immediately to force the match into the tie-breaker.

Tursunov avenged his defeat at Berdych's hands in the third round of the US Open last month and took away 52,000 dollars with his maiden career title.

Berdych, still looking for his first title this year after five appearances in the final, had won 15 of his last 19 matches but failed to deliver when it mattered most.

"I had my chances, but Dmitry played the crucial points better," said the 21-year-old. "But I reached the final and I am happy. Tursunov, seeded fourth here.

said he was "excited" about winning his first title but unhappy at serving 11 double faults in the final.

"I am excited but I could have served and plaved better." said the Russian. "Its been non-stop tennis for me and I am tired."

Meanwhile, the makeshift doubles pair of Mario Ancic of Croatia and India's Mahesh Bhupathi won their second consecutive doubles title.

Ancic and Bhupathi, who won the China Open two weeks ago, beat the Indian pair of Rohan Bopanna and Mustafa Ghouse 6-4, 6-7, 10-8 in the final.
