# Rockets, blast spark fresh fears for Musharraf

#### Rockets pointed towards Pak president's residence

Bomb disposal experts defused two rockets near President Pervez Musharraf's residence and the Pakistani parliament in Islamabad yesterday, hours after a blast in a park near his army home. The rockets were fixed to launchers and hidden in bushes at a construction site about half a kilometre (a third of a mile) from the key government buildings. Interior Minister Aftab Sherpao told AFP.

A mobile phone was linked by wires to both launchers, apparently as a remote triggering device for the Russian-made rockets, security officials said on condition of ano-

"These two rockets were not target-specific," Sherpao said, adding that the placing of the rockets "appears to be aimed at creating chaos and confusion in the capital and harassing the general public."

"It could also be an attempt to undermine the successful visit of President General Pervez Musharraf to the EU headquarters

in Belgium, Cuba, United States and United Kingdom.'

But a security official said the rockets were "apparently pointing

towards the presidency.' "Luckily some labourers working at a construction site saw the rockets and reported it to police," the official said

Police cordoned off the area and security forces detained 80 people working at the site for questioning, officials said

The fact that the 107 mm calibre rockets were made in Russia indicated they had come via Afghanistan, which borders on ex-Soviet Central Asia, and possibly implicates extremist Taliban rebels, security sources said. Later Musharraf arrived by

licopter at an Islamabad conference hall to give a speech -- shortly after three heavily guarded but empty motorcades had driven up in an apparent decoy security mea-

Musharraf, who has survived at least four previous assassination attempts, did not comment on the

The rockets were discovered about 12 hours after an explosion in a public park near General Musharraf's army residence in the garrison city of Rawalpindi, which adioins Islamabad, late Wednesday.

Chief military spokesman Major General Shaukat Sultan told AFP the blast "had nothing to do with the president or army house"

Sultan, who is also Musharraf's press secretary, said some explosive material was found at the blast site and that police were investigating. Police said they sent another bomb disposal team and search parties to the site.

One security official earlier told AFP that the blast in Ayub Park was caused by a rocket but senior authorities later denied this. Officials also rejected reports that a large quantity of unexploded material was found

Musharraf, a key ally in the US "war on terror", seized power in a SEE PAGE 19 COL 3

The board of directors of the Oriental Bank yesterday rejected the Bangladesh Bank (BB) investigation report about embezzlement of huge sums of money and claimed that no member of the board was involved in any corrupt practices.

"The board is not involved in any irregularities in the Oriental Bank and if there is any, the management is responsible for it," Mehedi Hasan, a member of the board of directors, told a press conference at a city

He also said that the board is not involved in any routine work of the bank, adding that only the management of the bank maintains records

## Ecnec rejects revised budget proposal, asks for re-tender

The Executive Committee on National Economic Council (Ecnec) Wednesday rejected a proposal to approve revised budget for the 150megawatt (MW) Chandpur power scheme -- which was already all set to be awarded to an incompetent Chinese company Harbin -- and asked the power ministry to retender the project.

In January, the Cabinet Purchase Committee had approved the Power Development Board's (PDB's) arbitrary selection of Harbin's bid and brushed aside a decision of a government review

Procurement Regulation (PPR) 2003, which opposed the bid.

The review panel in October 2005 had asked the PDB to disqualify the flawed bid of Harbin and negotiate with the two other bidders, based on their lowest price offers.

The government is financing the entire project. Sources said the prime minister was also preparing to naugurate' the project on October

Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman chaired both the meetings, the purchase committee SEE PAGE 19 COL 4

## Pressure builds for sanctions on Iran

World powers sit today to defuse nuke crisis

Foreign ministers from the six major powers seeking to defuse the Iran nuclear crisis were expected in London today, diplomats said, amid growing pressure for sanctions to be slapped on Tehran.

The British Foreign Office was refusing to confirm the talks, but sources said plans were going ahead for Britain, China, France, Russia, the United States and Germany to try to thrash out a joint

The six powers agreed to set a new deadline this week for Iran to comply with a UN resolution demanding it freeze its uranium

enrichment programme, which Washington and others believe is a cover for developing nuclear weap-

Otherwise, there is growing talk of imposing sanctions on the Islamic republic, which has repeatedly refused to commit itself to suspending enrichment despite the mounting diplomatic pressure.

"We have been following one track, that of negotiations, but this has come to nothing. So we now have to turn back to the other track," said a diplomatic source in
