ISI SUPPORT FOR TALIBAN Nato commanders want govts get tough with Pakistan

Nato commanders from five countries who have troops stationed in Afghanistan are demanding their governments get tough with Pakistan over its support for the Taliban militia, The Daily Telegraph reported yesterday.

Commanders from the United States, Britain, Canada, Denmark and the Netherlands want their governments to tell Pakistan to stop supporting the Taliban, which has stepped up its attacks in Afghanistan.

"It is time for an 'either you are with us or against us' delivered bluntly to Musharraf at the highest political level," an unnamed Nato commander told the newspaper

'Our boys in southern Afghanistan are hurting because what is coming out of (the of Pakistani city of) Quetta," the same commander added.

According to the newspaper, Nato's report on "Operation Medusa", the bloody campaign between September 4 and 17, clearly states that Pakistan's

intelligence service ISI was involved in supplying the Taliban. The report apparently estimates that the cost of Taliban ammunition stocks at around 2.6 million pounds (4.9 million dollars, 3.8 million euros).

"The Taliban could not have done this on their own without the ISI," an unnamed senior Nato officer was quoted as saying.

The report comes a day after Nato took over control of all foreign troops in Afghanistan, with British General David Richards taking charge.

The transfer saw 10.000 US troops who had been operating in the east under the US-led coalition fall under the 37-nation International Security Assistance Force (Isaf), boosting it to about 31.000 soldiers nationwide.

After the handover British Prime Minister Tony Blair said the Nato-led mission is "absolutely critical" for world security. Blair told reporters in Londor

that everybody was better off now in Afghanistan despite the renewed fighting.


Confesses militant in Sylhet

Moulana Abu Sayeed, who was arrested at a madrasa in Uttara in the capital last month, admitted his links with the September 26, 2001 bomb blast that took place in a house of Sylhet city's Fazilchist

Sayeed made a confessional statement before a magistrate Thursday evening saying the bombs exploded in the house where they were being manufactured killing two of the bomb makers. He said the bombs were supposed to be exploded at an Awami League (AL) meeting in Sylhet Alia Madrasa where AL chief Sheikh Hasina was to speak.

The blast took place hours ahead of the AL public meeting. Two young men. Shakil and Obaved, were killed on the spot while locals captured another when he was tying to flee the area minutes after the blast. Saveed along with seven others SEE PAGE 15 COL 6



Depression over Bay



World powers meet to decide action against Iran

Top officials from the United States, Britain, France, Germany, Russia and China gathered in London vesterday to decide a next step in the nuclear standoff with Iran.

They were expected to confirm that negotiations are at a standstill and refer Iran to the UN Security Council, which could then take up the question of sanctions on Tehran as early as next week.

To avoid alienating the Russians and the Chinese both major commercial partners of Iran any sanctions are likely to be relatively mild. Possibilities include embargoes on missile and nuclear technology and travel bans and other penalties on Iranian officials involved in the country's nuclear programme.

Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad said Thursday that his country would not be intimidated. "Those who threaten Iran by sanctions and embargo should know that this nation lived under the


