The government Thursday appointed a retired officer as member of finance in the Rural Electrification Board (REB) although the post was filled just two months ago under appropriate rules and regulations.

Sources said this has created strong resentment at the REB as this single contractual appointment has affected at least four posts where four officials were duly promoted two months back.

The sources said Prime Minister Khaleda Zia has signed the oneyear contract of Latifur Rahman as the REB's member of finance Thursday. The power ministry is now formalising his appointment.

Latifur Rahman retired as the controller of accounts and finances of the REB about 18 months ago, SEE PAGE 15 COL 3

Hope for settlement over Hasan issue

Wrapping up the third-round negotiations over electoral reforms yesterday, both the BNP and Awami League (AL) hoped for an amicable settlement of the dispute over Justice KM Hasan.

Sources said BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan hinted at the dialogue that his party might soften its stance on resolving first the issue of Justice Hasan who is supposed to take office as the next caretaker government head on October 28.

The AL-led 14-party combine has long been opposed to his tak-ing over as the chief of the next

Coming out of around an hourlong one-to-one dialogue at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban, Bhuiyan and AL General Secretary Abdul Jalil in a joint news conference declared that they hope they will be able to arrive at a consensus.

"The discussions will continue, and we will be able to work out a fair solution if all of you continue to support us," Bhuiyan told the press gathering.

Echoing the view, Jalil said: "We are continuing the discussion to create a proper atmosphere for the conduct of a free and fair election to advance the democratic promorning at the same place, declared the leaders adding that the negotiations so far have been Sources said at one point during

Bombs hurled at BNP MP's motorcade

8 injured

Unknown criminals hurled two bombs at a motorcade of lawmaker Shahidul Islam at Mirpur upazila in Kushtia yesterday leaving at least eight people injured including a police constable.

The injured are: Mirpur Upazila BNP president, also Mirpur municipality chairman, Saiful Haq Khan Chowdhury, BNP activists Allek, 32, Luthfor, 29, Manik, 23, Rahat, 31 Mostafa, 35, Rehana, 28, and police constable Dinesh, 42.

Allek's left wrist was blown off in the attack. The injured were admitted to Kushtia General Hospital and local clinics.

24pc population live in extreme poverty Reveals study

About 19 percent of the rural households cannot afford three meals a day while around 10 percent subsist on two meals or less for a number of months every year, reveals a study.

"While Bangladesh has come out of the 'shadow of famine', the problem of starvation persists. About 24 percent of the total population currently live in extreme income poverty," it said.

Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS) in cooperation with the Chronic Poverty Research Centre (CPRC) of UK carried out the study styled 'The State of the Poorest 2005-2006 -- Chronic Poverty in Bangladesh: Tales of Ascent, Descent, Marginality and Persistence'. It was jointly edited by researcher Binayak Sen and David

The study mentioned that around 31 percent of the rural population presently suffer the indignity of chronic poverty -- low consumption, hunger and undernutrition, lack of access to basic health services, illiteracy and other deprivations, for more than a

3 Jubo Dal men shot dead in Jhenidah UNB, Jhenidah

Three Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal activists were shot dead by unknown assailants in Sadar and Harinakundu upazilas on Saturday night.

Police said a gang of criminals shot fires at Lutfar Rahman Shanto, 35, publicity secretary of Jubo Dal's Sadar upazila unit, when he was sitting at a grocery shop at about 11.45pm.

Shanto died on the way to Hospital.

In another incident, Jubo Dal activists Sagar, 22, and Altaf, 45, were chopped and gunned down at a tea stall at Parbatipur in Harinakundu upazila at about

Later, Purbo Banglar Communist Party (ML-Janajuddha) claimed the responsibility of all the killings to journalists over mobile phone.

Local Jubo Dal staged demonstration in the town protesting the killings and demanded immediate arrest of the killers.

50 injured in AL-Shibir clash in Comilla

At least 50 people were injured in a clash between Awami League (AL) and Islami Chhatra Shibir activists in Chouddagram upazila headquarters Sunday after a Jamaat lawmaker came under "attack" during AL's protest programme. In protest against the "attack on


the MP", local chapter of Chhatra Shibir called a half-day hartal in Chouddagram on Monday. Witnesses said Chouddagram

Awami League organised a meeting in upazila headquarters at about 11:00am and later brought out a procession to protest the killing of Jubo League leader Hedayetullah at Cheura in Chouddhagram on Thursday.

At one stage, the demonstrators started hurling brickbats at Jamaat leader Dr Syed Abdullah M Taher MP's car passing by -- triggering a battle between AL and Shibir that left 20 injured on each side.

A BRTC bus on the nearby Dhaka-Chittagong highway was caught in the middle of the clash and 10 of its passengers were injured.
