Steven Gerrard is backing Wayne Rooney to bounce back from his disappointing international return against Macedonia by proving his worth against Croatia on Wednesday.

Manchester United forward Rooney, making his first international appearance since being sent off against Portugal at the World Cup, was substituted on 74 minutes after an unimpressive performance during the drab 0-0 at Old Trafford on Saturday.

But Gerrard, suspended for the now crucial Group E game against Croatia after picking up his second yellow card of the qualifying campaign against the Macedonians, insists that Rooney is more than capable of silencing his doubters in Gerrard said: "Wayne can han-

dle all the pressure and he will come through this no problem. He was our best player in training all week and he is the best player in the country

"I would not be surprised if he goes to Croatia and wins the game on his own for the country. That's how good Wayne is.

Rooney's partnership with Liverpool hitman Peter Crouch failed to worry the well-organised Macedonia defence, but Crouch insisted the pair will come good in given time to work on their double
