Bangladeshi shot dead by Indian forest quards

A Bangladeshi national was shot dead by Indian forest guards in Gachhuapara forest area in India vesterday.

The victim was identified as Tajuddin, 18, son of Abdul Jalil of Purba Gubrakura village under Haluaghat. Police said the Indian forest quards

shot Tajuddin after he entered into the Indian territory to collect firewood.

Locals rescued critically injured Tajuddin after he crossed the border and returned into Bangladeshi territory He succumbed to his injuries on way to the hospital.

Corruption has decreased in last five years, claims Tarique STAFF CORRESPONDENT

BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Tarique Rahman yesterday claimed that corruption has decreased gradually in the astfive years.

He also said that only his party, party Chairperson Khaleda Zia and the fourparty alliance can curb corruption.

Tarique was addressing an lftar party discussion organised by Ziaur Rahman Foundation at the LGED auditorium in the city. State Minister for Labour and Employment Amanullah Aman and State Minister for Education Ehsanul Haque Milon were also present.

Quoting a report of Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB), Tarique said the cost of corruption was Tk 17,192 crore in 2000, Tk 11,296 crore in 2001, Tk 4,391 crore in 2002, Tk 789 crore in 2003, Tk 413 crore in 2004 and Tk 426 crore in 2005.

He said the ruling party could not take adequate steps to curb corruption as it had to spend more time tackling non-political programmes of the opposition

On power crisis, he said, "Maybe we could not take enough measures to develop the power sector

Other BNP leaders and ministers also spoke at the programme and made indecent remarks on opposition leader Sheikh Hasina.

Govt dev programmes in urban areas only for rich

Speakers tell AL roundtable

The government is carrying out all the development programmes in urban areas only for the rich people,

not for the poor, speakers at a roundtable said yesterday. They said the government is only focusing on the urban development without taking the environmental

issues into consideration, thereby creating a lot of environment problems. The Awami League organised the roundtable on 'Unplanned urbanisation and its impact on the environment', with Obaidul Quader, joint general secretary of the party,

as the chief quest The population in urban areas has increased to 2.5 crore within the last 30 years and the number is

increasing at a rate of 6 percent, but no government has taken any initiatives to check the trend, said Prof Dr Nurul Islam Nazem. As a result, the urban system has

lost its equilibrium in all aspects, he said, adding that the demand for water in Dhaka city is 210 crore litres, but the Wasa can supply only 150 crore litres of water.

Forty percent of the people living in the city are poor, but the authorities do not have any plan for them to supply water and electricity, he said. And about 54 lakh people are living in 9,048 slums in the six cities, he added.

He also said the city has been experiencing sever water and air pollution due to lack of proper plan-Prof AQM Mahbub suggested

relocating industrial units and some aovernment offices in order to reduce traffic congestion in the city.

Prof AK Azad Chowdhury, former vice-chancellor of the Dhaka University, said it is high time to take steps to prevent the migration of the rural people to the cities.

The price of lands has increased manifold due to unplanned urbanisation in the last five years, he said. Dr Hossain Mansur also spoke at the roundtable moderated by Dr Hasan Mahmud, environment and forest secretary of the Awami League. Family members of Zakir Hossain alleged that the torture in Rab custody caused the death of the 'innocent'boy.

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) said Zakir had pains in the chest and hands while running to evade arrest at an open field at 3:00am on Tuesday. He succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital in the early of Wednesday.

But Zakir's father Zafar Hossain said some plainclothes law enforcers arrested him in presence of his mother Helena Begum in front of the Sony cinema hall at Mirpur immediately after Iftar on Monday. The Rab men also arrested

Zakir's friend Rubel from there at the same time, his father said. Rab in the first information report odged with Shah Ali Police Station at Mirpur in the city by Captain Ahmed Yusuf Jamil, termed Zakir as a 'terrorist' although no case or general diary

was found against him Zafar said the Rab men beat his son severely in its custody and then took him to hospital. "They even refused to say anything about his arrest when we inquired about my son in the Rab-4 office," he told The Daily Star.

The plainclothes men even refused to say anything about his arrest when my wife wanted to know why they were taking her son," Zafar said quoting his wife.

"We then contacted the local police station and the Rab-4 office over phone both denied arrest of anyone by the name," said the weeping father.

Echoing his views, the state minister told reporters that the new decision has nothing to do with land grabbers. But it is important to us as the law ministry could not vet amending the project deal due to the previous suggestion of the House body.

After the walkout, JP lawmaker Golam Habib Dulal said, "They (ruling coalition members) have discussed Bhashantek project as they took money from the project director. So, we have walked out of the meeting to protest this."

He alleged that the committee has totally failed to perform its duties properly. It could not take a single decision against the land grabbers.

AL lawmaker Enamul Haque told reporters, "Earlier the committee had suggested stopping the project due to corruption, and the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) is working on it. But the committee has now taken a new decision without getting any report from the PMO."

Promod Mankin alleged that the ruling alliance members and the land ministry took up Bhashantek issue first in their own interest.


Much violence against children remains hidden and is often socially approved, according to United Nations Secretary General's Study on Violence against Children.

Violence against children knows no frontier, cutting across all types of diversity in culture, class, education income and ethnic origin, said the study

"In Bangladesh, the number of cases coming into public view on violence against children are alarming, and more cases are out of our view. The government and other agencies are taking steps to stop or reduce the incidences of abuse, but there is still a long way to go," said Edward Thomas Espey, country director, Plan International, said at the launching ceremony of the study in the city.

The study concludes that for many children violence is routine, a part of their daily reality and stressed an end to adult justification of violence against children, whether accepted as 'tradition' or disguised as discipline.

Speaking at the programme, Kamaluddin Ahmed, secretary to the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, referred to the National Plan of Action (NPA) 2005-10 and reiterated the government's commitment to protecting children from all forms of abuse and violence.

The study was carried out in one rural site in Kishoreganj and two urban sites in Dhaka city.

The study concentrated on violence on five settings -- the home and family, schools and educational settings, care and judicial institutions, the workplace and the community.

Ichchey Media Group, a children's media house, presented a monitoring report based on content analysis of five major Bangla national dailies between February and December 2006. According to the report, there were 798 reported cases of 12 different kinds of violence against children ranging from rape and murder to physical and psychological persecu-

Unicef Bangladesh Representative Louis-Georges Arsenault emphasised a multi-sectoral and multi-pronged approach to address the multidimensional and complex issues surrounding violence against children.

EC officials will inspect the bidding organisations today and tomorrow, EC organisations to see the facilities for such a heavy task, EC sources said.

Earlier Election Commission secretary Abdur Rashid Sarker said it would cost maximum Tk 15 crore to print the voter list for the next general election.
