Dhaka supports international convention on terrorism

Dr Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury, Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations, said Bangladesh will cooperate with the UN in framing an international convention against terrorism.

"Bangladesh condemns terrorism in all its forms and manifestations," he said in a debate on "Measure to eliminate international terrorism" in the Legal Committee (Sixth) of the UN General Assembly in New York on Wednesday, accord-

ing to a message received here

However, he stated that genuine struggle against colonial domination or foreign domination does not fall within the purview of the definition of terrorism. Bangladesh herself had fought a War of Liberation, much of which was conducted unconventionally.

No War of Independence has been any different. Terrorism "must not be confused with genuine popular freedom movement," he suggested

The Bangladesh ambassador

criticised those who attempt to link terrorism with one religion, Islam. "This is not only unfair, but also imprudent. It ignores Islam's great contribution to human civilisation and culture, and only increases the divide separating nations and people", he said.

He told delegations that in order to foster international understanding, the Bangladesh delegation each year introduces a resolution on a "Culture of Peace" in the General Assembly. "We will also do so this year, and will hope for its unanimous adoption", he added.

Price hike of forms protested

Speakers at a rally here yesterday termed the price hike of admission forms of Chittagong University (CU) as one sort of commercialising the education and called upon all to resist it.

They were speaking at a student-teacher-guardian solidarity rally organised by Pragotishil Chhatra Jote Chittagong University (CU) unit in front of Chittagong Press Club in the morning.

Leaders of the alliance alleged that it costs only Tk 50 to complete all the process of admission including form and question paper printing and taking test. But, the authorities raised the price to Tk 300 from Tk 250 with an ill motive of sharing the additional money among themselves, they added.

They announced to observe blockade programme at all the banks that sell the admission forms from Sunday unless the authority withdraws the increased price before then.
