# 5 US soldiers, 10 others die in attacks, bombings

### AP, Baghdad

Suspected Shia militiamen killed at least 46 Sunni Arabs in a weekend rampage of revenge killing in a city north of Baghdad, an Interior Ministry official said Sunday, raising the toll in the latest sectarian bloodletting there to 63. A string of bombings in the north-

ern city of Kirkuk killed 10 people, including two girls who died when a

man detonated explosives strapped to his body in front of the al-Mallimin girls high school in downtown Kirkuk, police officials said.

The US military reported the deaths of a Marine and four soldiers, in statements late Saturday and Sunday. The Marine was killed in combat in Anbar province, the Sunni heartland west of Baghdad on Saturday

Three soldiers died in a roadside

bombing Saturday south of Baghdad, and one soldier was killed in a roadside bombing Friday night southwest of the capital.

The sectarian killings Saturday and Sunday in Balad, 80km north of Baghdad, were in apparent retaliation for the slayings of 17 Shias, whose decapitated bodies were found in an orchard on the SEE PAGE 15 COL 7
