The president is constitutionally empowered to issue proclamation of emergency on his own for 120 days if addressed the rally. he is satisfied that a grave emergency situation exists in which either security or economy of the country or any part thereof is threatened by war or external aggression or internal disturbance. In case of proclamation of emergency, counter signature of the prime minister is necessary when a political government is in office, but this is not applicable when the caretaker government is operating.

If the president issues the proclamation of emergency and wants to extend its time, the next parliament-which will be formed after the upcoming elections--will have to adopt a resolution in this regard, otherwise the emergency shall cease to operate upon expiry of 120 days.

While a proclamation of emergency is in operation, articles 36, 37, 38. 39. 40 and 42 of the constitution shall remain ineffective.
