# Ctg port chokes with container congestion

### Political unrest makes matter worse; 30 ships waiting for loading, unloading

Life at the port city Chittagong came to a standstill due to Awami League (AL) led 14-party combine's blockade programme started yesterday.

With 30 ships waiting for loading and unloading, the country's premier Chittagong seaport is also facing the most awful congestion in the recent time due to the volatile political situation in the country.

The 14-party combine enforced a continuous siege programme in the capital and Chittagong and Mongla seaports from yesterday demanding implementation of their

At a rally on Thursday, Mayor of Chittagong City Corporation ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury also programme in the port city yesterday and continuous hartal from today obstructing transport of goods from and to Chittagong.

Due to the blockade, few vehicles plied while mills and factories remained closed. Loading and unloading at the

port came to a minimum level. It is feared that the congestion at the port will increase further as

Every day five to seven ships arrive at the port for loading and unloading goods, sources said.

Twenty-three container vessels have been waiting at the outer anchorage of the port while another

seven ships are at the port jetty, port sources said. Of the 23 ships waiting at the outer anchorage, 19 are container vessels and four bulk

> Some 19,000TEU containers are now stockpiled at the port yard having capacity of 13,000 TEUs and it adds to the huge congestion there, sources said, adding that there is hardly any space left at the port yard for keeping newly arrived contain-

Due to heavy congestion at the port a ship has to wait at least seven to ten days at the outer anchorage to get permission for entering the port

### Politically divided doctors, students clash

At least five people were injured at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) yesterday after two doctors' organisations clashed with each other over holding rallies

Meanwhile, Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) beat up two Mahila Jubo League leaders at TSC intersection in Dhaka University

In BSMMU, two doctors' organisations clashed over occupying Bot Tala where both the organisations had declared to hold rallies on the same day and at the same time. Witnesses said Awami League

(AL)-backed Swadhinata Chikitshak Parishad (SCP) was holding a rally chaired by its President Mohammad Arsenol and General Secretary Sharif Uddin at Bot Tala around 11:30am yesterday.

The BNP-backed Doctors Association of Bangladesh (Dab) led by its President ZM Jahid Hasan and General Secretary Abdus Salam approached the spot trigger-

The two doctors' bodies pelted brickbats at each other that left five injured. A number of windowpanes

of BSMMU were smashed. Later the battle spread to Shahbagh area where SCP men torched furniture and a motorcycle

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) men rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) beat up two Jubo Mahila League leaders, exploded bombs, fired shots in the air and drove Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL)

men out of DU campus yesterday. The JCD men attacked and beat them up as they were passing TSC intersection.

The JCD, student wing of BNP, in a bid to keep its supremacy on the campus guarded the campus at different spots armed with sticks and iron rods.

Around noon, JCD men set fire to a BCL leader's motorbike on the same spot. The also fired four shots and exploded three bombs, witnesses said. The JCD men also attacked a BCL procession at Palashi around 2:30pm.

# N Korea preparing for another N-test

Fear US, S Korea

South Korean and US officials are monitoring the construction of a new building and other activities at a suspected North Korean nuclear site, trying to determine if the communist country is planning a second test detonation, news reports said vesterday South Korea is keeping a close

watch on the movement of trucks and soldiers at the Punggye-ri site in the North Korea's remote northeast, Yonhap news agency reported, citing several unidentified military officials. One official, however, said a second test was "not believed to

"We are closely monitoring to see if these are preparations for a second nuclear test," another official was quoted as saying.

South Korea has also detected a new building being erected at the site, the JoongAng Ilbo newspaper

reported, citing unidentified government officials

Separate US and South Korean studies have detected abnormal radiation in air samples, confirming the North has conducted a nuclear test. The South Korean government has pointed to Punggye-ri as a place where the North most likely have conducted the underground blast.

"Intelligence agencies from South Korea and the United States are trying to confirm whether this new building is connected to another nuclear test," an official was quoted as saying.

It was not immediately clear how military officials first spotted the activities at the site. However, the United States and South Korea generally share intelligence information from satellite images.

South Korea's Defence Ministry said it could not confirm the reports. SEE PAGE 15 COL 7

## 2 outlaws killed in gunfight with Rab

Two members of the outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP-Janajuddho) were killed during a fierce gunfight between the outlaws and the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) in Mirpur upazila of the district on Friday night.

ment, acting on a tip-off, a team led by Major Hafiz went to the house of Habib Uddin at West Duarpara in Mirpur upazila at around 5:30pm where the outlaw leader was supposed to be presiding over a secret
