
# Veteran artiste on the transition of music scene

HE recent talent hunt shows in the country are doing a great job, reinforcing the revival of songs many thought were long lost. The revival began, I believe, with young composers tinkering with the folk songs, and soon there were music lovers across the country once more humming the classics. It seems the worldwide telecast of the talent shows, where performers are singing not only folk, but also erstwhile-adhunik songs, have once more brought to light, not only the tremendous talent pool that we have but also the rich archive of songs," says popular adhunik singer of the '70s and '80s Khurshid Alam.

The discussion rapidly shifted to a range of topics during a short break at a concert


"Very few people know that my initial



training was in Tagore songs," he said. "Born and brought up in old Dhaka, I come from an area where SM Parvez, popular singer Moslehuddin and other prominent people used to live.

"At the weekly rehearsals held at Dhaka Shilpi Sangha headed by my uncle eminent lyricist Dr Abu Hyder Sajedur Rahman AKA Dr Mastana, I remember film actress Johorat Ara, dancer Rosy Imam and others would

join in regularly," remembers Alam.
"Adhunik song is the soul of my being...

and fittingly, my entrance to this world was almost by fate," he says. At the national level competitions of Education Week in 1961-62 in the erstwhile East Pakistan, Alam had won the first prize in Tagore songs, and was keenly looking forward to making his mark on the stage. However, at that time in 1965, Rabindra Sangeet was banned from the radio almost overnight. Considering his options. Alam decided to audition for adhunik (modern Bangla songs). And as the music world watched. Alam rose step by step to become one of the popular artistes of his

It was a golden era in Bangla music, when flurry of artistes Syed Abdul Hadi, MA Hamid, Md Ali Siddiqui, Khondokar Faruq Ahmed, Mahmud un Nabi, Abdul Jabbar, Anwaruddin Khan, Najmul Huda Bachchu, Anjuman Ara Begum, Ferdousi Rahman, Sabina Yasmin and Shahnaz Rahmatullah were household names.

Alam says, "I was fortunate enough to have done more than 300 playbacks under the guidance of celebrated composers Subal Das, Ali Hossain, Azad Rahman and Satva

"The music sessions with the music directors usually continued for hours. The studios at the radio office at Shahbagh and much later at Agargaon were the cultural hubs for the musicians. During this time the committed directors would sit together and discuss the latest compositions, " he says. Competition amongst artistes and composers was intense, but 'healthy', according to Alam. "There was mutual respect all around, and in general, people were supportive of each other," he adds.

He remembers one incident that high lighted this feeling more than anything else. At that time Alam bagged a contract to sing the playback for Agantuk, the first of his countless playbacks in 1969. Such was the bond between artistes and directors that several directors turned up at the recording simply because as they said "It was our Khurshid's debut!"

"With such wholehearted support, readily felt motivated to give my utmost effort in every song I recorded," he says. One of the songs in that film, Bondi pakhir moton is written by Dr AH Sajedur Rahman and composed by Azad Rahman. Among other songs such as Chonchol du noyoney bolona ki khujchcho, Tomar du hath chhuye sopoth nilam and Pitch dhala eyi path tarey in the film Shadharan meye (composed by Robin Ghosh and written by Gazi Mazharul Anwar) were on everybody's lips before long.

Coming back to talent hunts he observes, "Listening to many such songs that were recorded ages ago with so much emotion, brings back memories. Songs can live on forever when they find a home in the hearts of the young generation. I only hope the young talents continue to practice their art no matter what the results of the talent shows Only then, instead of having one winner at the end, you will have 140 million winners across the country and beyond."

## 'Ghar Phera': TV serial on drug rehab

I want this TV play to have an impact and I've tried to keep things real but to the point that it looks more like a documentary."

Though there is no written form of Achik language available in the country, composers had to work years together collecting the appropriate words or idioms or metaphors to authentically express the tales of Garo life in the forest. The beauty of nature, love,

rituals, festivals, woes and sufferings of the marginalised community are narrated through the lyrics where one could feel the essence of simplicity amongst the forest dwell-Jajong, moonlight, Shal, Sun,

and different deities of the ancient community are praised in several songs. The songs are selected giving priority to the variety of the traditional music of the community

Traditional and local musical instruments including dama, drum, rang, common reed, shanaai, changchap, cymbal, adury, flute, and harmonium are the instruments the group use during their gig or tour somewhere around the locality. Four vocalists Madhuri Nokrek Hanna Dalbot, Choyoni Nokrek and Teeres Nokrek form the group accompanied by Naieet Mree and Jolen Dalbot on the musical instru-

## Imelda Marcos to launch fashion line

Imelda Marcos notorious for her extensive shoe collection and eyepopping jewels accrued under her husband's dictatorship is launching a jewellery collection using cast-offs from her wardrobe and, she claims, flea market finds.

Marcos, known for her shopping trips to ritzy stores in New York while the country wallowed in poverty, says she made the pieces from her old accessories and clothes, mixed with newly bought stones and other materials

Her daughter, Imee Marcos, said that unknown to many people, her mother shops for trinkets and accessories at flea markets, and keeps earrings with a missing pair or brooches that have some missing stones.

Using a glue gun, scissors or pliers, her mother "can combine them with her vintage items in a way that comes out beautiful,"


Monday during a promotional photo shoot for "The Imelda Collection," which is to be launched November 18 in Manila. The 77-year old widow of

Ferdinand Marcos said the jewellery collection was the idea of her grandson, Martin "Borgy" Manotoc, who told her, "You are creating beautiful things, like jewels from practically garbage."

Marcos said the items would be inexpensive, costing from \$20 to \$100. But her daughter said prices and details about the collection are still being ironed out The jewellery collection is a far

cry from the dozens of suitcases of genuine diamond tiaras, ruby brooches, emerald necklaces and other jewels the government confiscated from Marcos and which officials plan to auction off.

The Marcoses have been accused of amassing ill-gotten wealth and were driven out of the

presidential palace by a militarybacked nonviolent "people power" uprising in 1986. The ousted strongman died in exile in Hawaii three years later.
