### Ortega on brink of return to presidency

Nicaragua's former Marxist guerrilla-president Daniel Ortega is almost certain to complete a long climb back to power yesterday with an election win that could upset his old Cold War enemy, the United States.

Ortega had a clear lead as results trickled in from Sunday's presidential vote and victory was expected to be confirmed with a final batch of returns on Tuesday. Thousands of his left-wing Sandinista party supporters celebrated in the streets on Monday night, some on horseback.

# No cut-off time for vessels piles goods

In absence of any cut off time, the feeder vessels often spend long time for loading export items after discharging the import goods, adding to the ship congestion at the overburdened Chittagong port.

Due to lack of smooth supply chain, many ships wait at the jetty for 48 to 72 hours in getting export cargo that leads to the increase of the number of the ships waiting in queue at the outer anchorage. sources said

The export items are supposed to be assembled earlier and loaded in the ship immediately after the discharge of import goods, but often it does not happen at Chittagong As there is no cut off time, the

shipping agent can easily extend the expected time of departure (ETD) of a ship for loading more

The extra berth fare that a ship has to pay for spending additional time at the jetty is only about \$300 per day, an amount equivalent to the freight of one TEUs container cargo but a ship staying one-day additional time at the jetty can load 50-60 containers.

So. the incidence of delaying ETD and loading unscheduled cargo are very common in Chittagong port and sometimes containers are loaded with false declaration, said a high official of the

In May this year, a ship named Express Resolve leaned to one side after sailing as 26 unscheduled containers were loaded in it, making the weight of the cargo more thar the declared weight, he said

Later, the ship was tagged to the jetty again and the additional containers were off-loaded.

The turn around time at the port took up to 15 days as a ship had to wait 7-10 days at the outer anchorage before getting permission to enter into the port channel. Now 20 ships are waiting at the outer anchorage for getting berthing permission while nine ships are at different jetties

## Nagorik Committee proposes amendments to RPO

Nagorik Committee 2006 prepared a set of recommendations for the caretaker government for bringing amendments to the Representation of the People Order (RPO) 1972 in an effort to ensure transparency in

the electoral process. The committee said influence of black money and muscle in elections could be reduced through bringing necessary amendments to the RPO.

The six-point recommendation calls for compulsory registration of political parties, bar on participation in elections by government officials within three years of their retirements, disclosure of information about assets and financial liabilities

of candidates, formation of 'disqualification commissions' for cancelling candidatures in cases of proven violation of electoral code of conducts and for resolving electoral disputes within six months of filing of the cases.

The recommendations were prepared on the basis of a dialogue among civil society members, professionals and representatives of other stake holders on November

The committee thinks that the proposed amendments should be implemented through an ordinance. The committee also prepared a draft of the ordinance which will be handed over to the president for incorporating the recommendations in the law very soon.

Members of Nagorik Committee 2006 yesterday briefed journalists about their recommendations at a news conference in the National Press Club in the capital. The Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) worked as the secretariat of

Nagorik Committee. Executive Director of CPD Debapriya Bhattacharya said details of the recommendations were prepared through a dialogue at grassroots level. The people may get some benefit of the dialogue in the upcoming general election SEE PAGE 15 COL 4
